1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 2 AN ACT TO ASSIST IN THE REPAYMENT OF LAW SCHOOL LOANS OWED 3 BY ATTORNEYS WHO GRADUATED FROM LAW SCHOOL IN NORTH 4 CAROLINA AND WHO ARE EMPLOYED BY THE STATE OR LOCAL GOVERNMENT AND TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS. 5 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 6 Section 1. Chapter 116 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new 7 8 article to read: 9 "ARTICLE 23A. "LOAN REPAYMENT PROGRAM FOR PUBLIC ATTORNEYS. 10 "§ 116-209.30. Definitions. 11 As used in this Article: 12 'Eligible employment' means employment as an attorney by the State 13 (1)or any local government in the State, but does not mean employment 14 as a research assistant in any court of the General Court of Justice. 15 'Law school loan' means any loan for attendance at a law school in 16 (2)North Carolina that is obtained for tuition, educational expenses, or 17 living expenses from a college or university, government, or 18 commercial source. 19 "§ 116-209.31. Loan Repayment Program for Public Attorneys established. 20 The Loan Repayment Program for Public Attorneys is established for the purpose of 21 encouraging and assisting attorneys who receive their professional degree in this State 22 to seek employment by the State or local governments in the State. 23 "§ 116-209.32. - Assistance Authority the sum of fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) for the 1992-93 fiscal
 year to implement Section 1 of this act.
- 4 Sec. 3. This act becomes effective July 1, 1992.

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
