2	AN ACT TO INCREASE THE FINES FOR LITTERING AND TO CLARIFY THE		
3	STATUTES RELATING TO LITTERING.		
4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:		
5	Section 1. G.S. 14-399 reads as rewritten:		
6	"§ 14-399. Littering.		
7	(a) No person, including but not limited to, any firm, organization, private		
8	corporation, or governing body, agents or employees of any municipal corporation shall		
9	intentionally or recklessly throw, scatter, spill or place or intentionally or recklessly		
10	cause to be blown, scattered, spilled, thrown or placed or otherwise dispose of any litter		
11	upon any public property or private property not owned by him within this State or in		
12	the waters of this State including, but not limited to, any public highway, public park,		
13	lake, river, ocean, beach, campground, forest land, recreational area, trailer park,		
14	highway, road, street or alley except:		
15	(1) When such property is designated by the State or political subdivision		
16	thereof for the disposal of garbage and refuse, and such person is		
17	authorized to use such property for such purpose; or		
18	(2) Into a litter receptacle in such a manner that the litter will be prevented		
10	from being corriad arrow or denogited by the elements ynon any part of		

from being carried away or deposited by the elements upon any part of 19 such private or public property or waters. 20

When litter is blown, scattered, spilled, thrown or placed from a vehicle or 1 (b)2 watercraft, the operator thereof shall be presumed to have committed such offense. This 3 presumption, however, does not apply to a vehicle transporting agricultural products or supplies when the litter from that vehicle is a nontoxic, biodegradable agricultural 4 5 product or supply.

6 (c)Any person who violates this section in an amount not exceeding 15 pounds 7 or 27 cubic feet-and not for commercial purposes is guilty of a misdemeanor punishable 8 by a fine of not less than fifty dollars (\$50.00)-one hundred dollars (\$100.00) nor more 9 than two hundred dollars (\$200.00) five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for the first offense. 10 Any second or subsequent offense is punishable by a fine of not less than fifty dollars (\$50.00)-one hundred dollars (\$100.00) nor more than five hundred dollars (\$500.00).-one 11 12 thousand dollars (\$1,000). Notwithstanding the foregoing, any person who violates this 13 section by disposing, in any manner, of litter not exceeding 15 pounds or 27 cubic feet not for commercial purposes upon a beach is guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not less 14 15 than fifty dollars (\$50.00) nor more than five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for a first or any subsequent offense. In addition, the court may require the violator to pick up litter or 16 17 perform other labor commensurate with the offense committed.

18 Any person who violates this section in an amount exceeding 15 pounds or 27 (d)cubic feet, but not exceeding 500 pounds in weight or 100 cubic feet in volume, and not for 19 20 commercial purposes, purposes is guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not less than fifty dollars (\$50.00) one hundred dollars (\$100.00) nor more than five hundred 21 22 dollars (\$500.00). one thousand dollars (\$1,000). In addition, the court shall require the 23 violator to pick up litter or perform other community service commensurate with the 24 offense committed. Further, if the violation involves the use of a motor vehicle, upon a 25 finding of guilt, regardless of whether adjudication is withheld or of whether imposition of 26 sentence is withheld, deferred, or suspended, the court shall forward a record of the finding to 27 the Department of Transportation, Division of Motor Vehicles, which shall record a penalty of 28 one point on the violator's drivers license pursuant to the point system established by G.S. 20-29 16. There shall be no insurance premium surcharge or assessment of points under the 30 elassification plan adopted pursuant to G.S. 58-30.4 for a finding of guilt under this subsection. 31 Any person who violates this section in an amount exceeding 500 pounds or (e)

100 cubic feet-or in any quantity for commercial purposes, or dumps-who discards litter 32 33 which that is a hazardous waste as defined in G.S. 130A-290 is guilty of a Class J 34 felony. In addition, the court may order the violator to:

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- Remove, or render harmless, the litter that he dumped discarded in (1)violation of this section;
- (2)Repair or restore property damaged by, or pay damages for any damage arising out of, his dumping-discarding litter in violation of this section; or
- 40 (3) Perform community public service relating to the removal of litter dumped discarded in violation of this section or to the restoration of an 41 area polluted by litter dumped discarded in violation of this section. 42

43 (f) A court may enjoin a violation of this section.

If a violation of this section involves the operation of a motor vehicle, upon a 44 (f1)finding of guilt, the court shall forward a record of the finding to the Department of 45

8	violation of this section is declared contraband and is subject to seizure and summary			
9	forfeiture to the State.			
10	(h) If a person sustains damages arising out of a violation of this section that is			
11	punishable as a felony, a court, in a civil action for such damages, shall order the person			
12	to pay the injured party threefold the actual damages or two hundred dollars (\$200.00),			
13	whichever amount is greater. In addition, the court shall order the person to pay the			
14	injured party's court costs and attorney's fees.

16	(1)	'Aircraft' means a motor vehicle or other vehicle that is used or		
17		designed to fly, but does not include a parachute or any other device		
18		used primarily as safety equipment.		
19	(2)	'Commercial vehicle' means a vehicle that is owned or used by a		
20		business, corporation, association, partnership, or sole proprietorship		
21		or any other entity conducting business for economic gain.		
22	(3)	'Law enforcement officer' means any officer of the North Carolina		
23		Highway Patrol, the Division of Motor Vehicles of the Department of		
24		Transportation, a county sheriff's department, a municipal law

3 (j) It shall be the duty of all law enforcement officers to enforce the provisions of 4 this section.

5 (k) This section does not limit the authority of any State or local agency to 6 enforce other laws, rules or ordinances relating to litter or solid waste management."

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Sec. 2. G.S. 7A-148(a) reads as rewritten:

8 "(a) The chief district judges of the various district court districts shall meet at 9 least once a year upon call of the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court to discuss mutual 10 problems affecting the courts and the improvement of court operations, to prepare and adopt a uniform schedule of traffic offenses, littering under G.S. 14-399(c), hunting and 11 12 fishing offenses under Chapter 113, boating offenses under Chapter 75A, and alcohol 13 offenses under Chapter 18B for which magistrates and clerks of court may accept 14 written appearances, waivers of trial or hearing and pleas of guilty or admissions of 15 responsibility, and establish a schedule of penalties or fines therefor, and to take such further action as may be found practicable and desirable to promote the uniform 16 administration of justice." 17 18 Sec. 3. This act becomes effective 1 October 1991 and applies to violations

19 that occur on or after that date.
