2	AN ACT TO PL	ROVIDE RESIDENCY DISTRICTS FOR ELECTION OF THE	
3	MARTIN CO	UNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS, TO IMPLEMENT A	
4	CONSENT (	ORDER IN THE CASE OF DANIELS V. BOARD OF	
5	COMMISSIONERS OF MARTIN COUNTY.		
6	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:		
7	Section	1. The Board of Commissioners of Martin County shall consist of	
8	five members, to	be elected at-large by the entire electorate of the county, under a	
9	system of limited voting, as follows:		
10	(1) T	There shall be two residency districts created within the county as	
11	fe	ollows:	
12	a	. The WESTERN DISTRICT shall consist of the townships of	
13		Poplar Point, Goose Nest, Hamilton, Robersonville and	
14		Crossroads;	
15	b	. The EASTERN DISTRICT shall consist of the townships of	
16		Williamston, Bear Grass, Jamesville, Williams and Griffin;	
17	(2) T	wo of the five commissioners shall reside in the WESTERN	
18	Γ	DISTRICT. They shall be elected simultaneously, and each voter in	
19	tl	ne county shall be permitted to cast one vote in the primary, and one	
20		ote in the general election, for these two commission seats;	
21	(3) T	Three of the five commissioners shall reside in the EASTERN	
22	Γ	DISTRICT. They shall be elected simultaneously, and each voter in	

1		the county shall be permitted to cast two votes in the primary, and two	
2		votes in the general election, for these three commission seats.	
3	(4)	The candidates receiving the highest number of votes shall be declared	
4		the winners of the primary, and of the general elections, respectively.	
5		No run-off elections shall be held.	
6	Sec. 2	2. Elections shall remain partisan, and terms of office shall continue to	
7	be four years, except as set forth in this act.		
8	Sec. 3	. This new system of election shall be implemented as follows:	
9	(1)	A regular election was scheduled for election of two members of the	
10		Board of Commissioners of Martin County for November 6, 1990.	
11		The primary election for those seats was already held in April of 1990.	
12		In light of the pending lawsuit and the desire of the parties to settle this	
13		matter, this election was held under the old system of election, except	
14		that the persons elected to office were elected to a two-year term,	
15		instead of a four-year term of office;	
16	(2)	All five seats on the Board of Commissioners of Martin County shall	
17		come up for election in 1992. Both the primary and general elections	
18		shall be held under the system of limited voting set out above, with	
19		each voter casting one vote for the commissioners in the WESTERN	
20		DISTRICT of the county, and casting two votes for the commissioners	
21		in the EASTERN DISTRICT of the county. The two commissioners	
22		elected to the WESTERN DISTRICT shall serve a two-year term;	
23		these two seats will therefore be up for election again in 1994, and	
24		every four years thereafter. The three commissioners elected to the	
25		EASTERN DISTRICT shall serve a four-year term, and shall be up for	
26		election again in 1996, and every four years thereafter.	
27	(3)	Except as they may conflict with the provisions of this act, the laws of	
28		the State of North Carolina shall continue to govern elections for the	
29		Board of Commissioners of Martin County and the laws of the State	
30		shall continue to govern and prescribe the powers and duties of the	
31	Sec. 1	Board of Commissioners.	
32		4. Chapter 741 of the 1955 Session Laws, Chapter 36 of the Public-	
33	Local Laws of 1937, Chapter 400 of the Public-Local Laws of 1935 and Chapter 291 of the 1907 Public Laws are hereby repealed.
