An-Any person, as an owner, lessee, occupant, or other person-otherwise in 8 (a) control of land-land, who allows without compensation another person to hike or-use the 9 land for recreational-scenic, recreation, connecting, or side trail purposes as established 10 under this Article or to construct, maintain, or cause to be constructed or maintained a 11 scenic, recreation, connecting, or side trail, owes the person the same duty of care he 12 13 owes a trespasser. 14 Any person who without compensation has constructed, maintained, or (b) caused to be constructed or maintained a scenic, recreation, connecting, or side trail 15 pursuant to an agreement with any person who is an owner, lessee, occupant, or 16 otherwise in control of land on which a trail is located shall owe a person using the trail 17 the same duty of care owed a trespasser. 18 Unless the context otherwise requires, the following definitions shall apply in 19 (c)this section: 20 21 'Scenic trail' means an extended trail so located as to provide (1)maximum potential for the appreciation of natural areas and for the 22
