March 28, 1991 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT TO MODIFY THE STATUTES COVERING SCHOLARSHIPS FOR CHILDREN OF WAR VETERANS TO INCLUDE THE CHILDREN OF VETERANS OF THE PERSIAN GULF WAR. The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: Section 1. G.S. 165-20(4) reads as rewritten: 'Period of war' and 'wartime' shall mean any of the periods or circumstances as defined below: World War I, meaning (i) the period beginning on April 6, 1917 a. and ending on November 11, 1918, and (ii) in the case of a veteran who served with the United States armed forces in Russia, the period beginning on April 6, 1917 and ending on April 1, 1920. World War II, meaning the period beginning on December 7, b. 1941 and ending on December 31, 1946. Korean Conflict, meaning the period beginning on June 27, c. 1950 and ending on January 31, 1955. Vietnam era, meaning the period beginning on August 5, 1964, d. and ending on May 7, 1975. Persian Gulf War, meaning the period beginning on August 2, d1.
