Section 1. The purpose of this act is to authorize construction, by certain constituent institutions of The University of North Carolina and the University of North Carolina Hospitals at Chapel Hill, of the capital improvements projects listed herein for each institution, and to authorize the financing of these said capital improvements projects with funds available to the institutions and the Hospitals from gifts, grants, receipts, self-liquidating indebtedness, or other funds, or any combination of such funds, but not including funds appropriated from the General Fund of the State.
