A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO THE ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICE OF 3 THE COURTS AND TO INCREASE THE MAXIMUM NUMBER OF
- 4 MAGISTRATES AUTHORIZED FOR CERTAIN COUNTIES.
- 5 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
- 6 INDIGENT PERSONS' ATTORNEY FEE FUND

7 Section 1. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Judicial 8 Department the sum of \$3,742,808 for the 1991-92 fiscal year and the sum of 9 \$3,865,760 for the 1992-93 fiscal year for the Indigent Persons' Attorney Fee Fund.

10 SPECIAL CAPITAL CASE REHEARING FUND

There is continued in the Judicial Department the nonreverting 11 Sec. 2. (a) special fund known as "The Special Capital Case Rehearing Fund." The funds shall be 12 used to provide for related expenses in connection with resentencing hearings, related 13 appeals, and post-conviction hearings required by the decisions of the United States 14 Supreme Court in McKoy v. North Carolina, March 5, 1990, and of the Supreme 15 Court of North Carolina upon the remand of that case, including the payment of 16 attorneys' fees and related expenses for representation of indigent persons. The Special 17 Capital Case Rehearing Fund shall terminate, and all funds remaining in it shall revert 18 to the General Fund, when the Director of the Administrative Office of the Courts 19 certifies to the State Controller that all reasonably foreseeable resentencing hearings, 20 related appeals, and post-conviction hearings have been substantially completed. 21
