1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT TO REDUCE THE COSTS OF ANIMAL CONTROL BY REQUIRING
3	CITIES AND COUNTIES TO CHARGE A LOWER ANIMAL TAX ON DOGS
4	THAT HAVE BEEN SPAYED OR NEUTERED, BY PROVIDING FOR LOCAL
5	CLINICS FOR THE SPAYING AND NEUTERING OF ANIMALS, AND BY
6	ESTABLISHING A PET FUND WITHIN THE ANIMAL WELFARE SECTION
7	OF THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE TO PROVIDE ASSISTANCE TO
8	THOSE CLINICS.
9	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
10	Section 1. G.S. 153A-153 reads as rewritten:
11	"§ 153A-153. Animal tax.
12	(a) A county may levy an annual license tax on the privilege of keeping dogs and
13	other pets within the county. <u>However, on and after January 1, 1995, any annual license</u>
14	tax on the privilege of keeping a dog that has not been spayed or neutered shall be at
15	least four times the annual license tax on the privilege of keeping a dog that has been
16	spayed or neutered.
17	(b) At least one-third of the proceeds from the annual license tax on the privilege
18	of keeping a dog, as authorized in subsection (a) of this section, shall be expended in
19	one or more of the following ways:
20	(1) Operation of a spaying and neutering clinic open to residents of the
21	county in which the license tax is collected;
22	(2) Operation of a voucher program through which the animal control
23	office of the county issues vouchers entitling recipients to reduced

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1	rates for the spaying or neutering of animals by licensed veterinarians
2	participating in such a program; or
3	(3) Transmittal of the funds to the Animal Welfare Section of the
4	Department of Agriculture for deposit in the Pet Fund administered by
5	the Section.
6	Veterinarians volunteering to participate in a voucher system established pursuant to
7	subdivision (b)(2) of this section shall receive no more than eighty percent (80%) of the
8	average fee charged by veterinarians in that county for spaying and neutering, as
9	determined by the Animal Welfare Section for each spaying or neutering performed."
10	Sec. 2. G.S. 160A-212 reads as rewritten:
11	"§ 160A-212. Animal taxes.
12	(a) A city shall have power to levy an annual license tax on the privilege of
13	keeping any domestic animal, including dogs and cats, within the city. <u>However, on and</u>
14	after January 1, 1995, any annual license tax on the privilege of keeping a dog that has
15	not been spayed or neutered shall be at least four times the annual license tax on the
16	privilege of keeping a dog that has been spayed or neutered. This section shall not limit
17	the city's authority to enact ordinances under G.S. 160A-186.
18	(b) At least one-third of the proceeds from the annual license tax on the privilege
19 20	of keeping a dog, as authorized in subsection (a) of this section, shall be expended in
20	one or more of the following ways:
21	(1) Operation of a spaying and neutering clinic open to residents of the
22 23	city in which the license tax is collected or to residents of any county
23 24	(2) <u>in which that city is located;</u>
24 25	(2) Operation of a voucher program through which the animal control
23 26	office of the city issues vouchers entitling recipients to reduced rates for the spaying or neutering of animals by licensed veterinarians
20 27	participating in such a program; or
27	(3) Transmittal of the funds to the Animal Welfare Section of the
28 29	Department of Agriculture for deposit in the Pet Fund administered by
30	the Section.
31	Veterinarians volunteering to participate in a voucher system established pursuant to
32	subdivision (b)(2) of this section shall receive no more than eighty percent (80%) of the
33	average fee charged by veterinarians in the county in which the license tax is collected
34	is located for spaying and neutering, as determined by the Animal Welfare Section for
35	each spaying or neutering performed."
36	Sec. 3. G.S. 19A-22 reads as rewritten:
37	"§ 19A-22. Animal Welfare Section in Animal Health Division of Department of
38	Agriculture created; <del>Director.</del> <u>Director; Pet Fund established.</u>
39	(a) There is hereby created within the Animal Health Division of the North
40	Carolina Department of Agriculture, a new section thereof, to be known as the Animal
41	Welfare Section of said division.
42	The Commissioner of Agriculture is hereby authorized to appoint a Director of said
43	section whose duties and authority shall be determined by the Commissioner subject to
44	the approval of the Board of Agriculture and subject to the provisions of this Article.

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1 2	(b) <u>There is established within the Department of Agriculture, Animal Health</u> Division, Animal Welfare Section, a Pet Fund to provide assistance to cities and
3	counties in maintaining spaying and neutering clinics. Monies from the Pet Fund shall
4	be distributed to cities and counties to fund the spaying and neutering clinics established
5	pursuant to G.S. 153A-153(b) and G.S. 160A-212(b) based upon need as demonstrated
6	to the pet officer appointed in subsection (c) of this section.
7	(c) <u>The Animal Welfare Section may appoint a pet officer whose responsibilities</u>
8	shall include distribution of funds to city and county spaying and neutering clinics
9	established pursuant to G.S. 153A-153(b) and G.S. 160A-212(b), the design and
10	issuance of spaying and neutering vouchers for use by those clinics, maintenance of
11	records for the clinics, and the provision of advisory assistance to the clinics. The pet
12	officer shall provide an annual report to the General Assembly on the activities of the
13	local spaying and neutering clinics."
14	Sec. 4. G.S. 130A-188 reads as rewritten:
15	"§ 130A-188. Fee for vaccination at county rabies vaccination clinics.
16	The county board of commissioners is authorized to establish a fee to be charged at
17	the county rabies vaccination clinics. The fee shall include an administrative charge not
18	to exceed four dollars (\$4.00) and forty cents (\$4.40) per vaccination, and a charge for
19	the actual cost of the vaccine, the vaccination certificate, and the rabies vaccination tag.
20	Forty cents (40¢) from each administrative charge shall be transmitted to the Pet Fund
21	administered by the Animal Welfare Section of the Department of Agriculture."
22	Sec. 5. This act becomes effective January 1, 1994.
