A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO BE PAID TO EIGHT PRIVATE NONPROFIT CHILD CARING AGENCIES AS GRANTS-IN-AID TO PRIVATE CHILD CARING INSTITUTIONS. The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: Section 1. In addition to any other funds appropriated for this purpose by law, there is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Human Resources the sum of four hundred thirty-eight thousand eighty-five dollars (\$438,085) for the 1993-94 fiscal year and the sum of four hundred thirty-eight thousand eighty-five dollars (\$438,085) for the 1994-95 fiscal year to be allocated to the following
nonprofit child caring agencies as State grants-in-aid:
(1) Bertie-Martin-Beaufort Shelter Home, Inc., in Jamesville;
(2) Caldwell Residential Services, Inc., in Lenoir;(3) Caring for Children, Inc., in Asheville;
(4) Children's Home Society Foundation, Inc., in Greensboro;
(5) Children's Homes of Cleveland County, Inc., in Shelby;
(6) Loray Girls Home, Inc., in Gastonia;
(7) Yahweh Center, Inc., in Wilmington; and
(8) Youth Homes, Incorporated, in Charlotte.
Sec. 2. The purpose of these funds is to provide partial reimbursement to the

named agencies for the placement of certain children by county departments of social

services. The children for whom these funds are appropriated are children not eligible for federal matching funds under Title IV-E foster care maintenance payments.

- Sec. 3. The funds appropriated in Section 1 of this act shall be paid by the Department of Human Resources to the eight designated agencies in accordance with the provisions of North Carolina Administrative Code, Section 10, Subchapter 41M, for the payment of grants-in-aid to private child caring institutions.
- Sec. 4. Any future request for grants-in-aid to the eight designated agencies shall be submitted along with the requests of the other eligible private child caring institutions according to the provisions of the North Carolina Administrative Code, Section 10, Subchapter 41M.
 - Sec. 5. This act becomes effective July 1, 1993.
