6	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:	
7	Sectio	on 1. (a) Rules for the monthly schedule of payments for the purchase
8	of day care serv	ices for low-income children shall be established by the Social Services
9	Commission pu	rsuant to G.S. 143B-153(8)a. Requirements for the adoption of these
10	rules include:	
11	(1)	Establishment of a statewide market payment rate calculated as a
12		statewide market rate representing the 75th percentile of all day care
13		rates by type of provider for all ages of children from every county;
14	(2)	Provision for market rate establishment and payment for counties
15		whose individual market rates are higher than the State market rate;
16		and
17	(3)	Provision of incentives to provide quality day care by providing
18		payment differentials among day care providers as follows:
19		a. Registered homes and "A"centers - the statewide market rate or
20		the county market rate, whichever is higher;
21		b. Unregistered homes - ten percent (10%) less than the rate for

1	c. "AA"centers - ten percent (10%) more than the rate for		
2	"A"centers.		
3	(b) In addition to the requirements set by subsection (a) of this section, the		
4	Social Services Commission shall, in establishing rules for the monthly schedule of		
5	payments, give consideration to the need to maintain the level of care, and the higher		
6	cost of this care, that has been established by those providers who have been the		
7	recipients of reallocated funds in addition to initial allocations.		
8	(c) In order to further the goal of providing quality day care to all of North		
9	Carolina's children in need of care, the General Assembly finds that, in the near future,		
10	the payment rate structure should consider:		
11	(1) Provision of increased rates for "accredited" day care; and		
12	(2) Rates for day care providers "at cost", if the providers have their		
13	budgets approved by their county day care administrator.		
14	Sec. 2. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of		
15	Human Resources, Division of Facility Services, Day Care Section, the sum of thirteen		
16	million dollars (\$13,000,000) for the 1993-94 fiscal year and the sum of thirteen million		
17	dollars (\$13,000,000) for the 1994-95 fiscal year to implement this act.		
18	Sec. 3. This act becomes effective July 1, 1993.
