AN ACT TO ALLOW LAW OFFICERS WHO ARE MEMBERS OF THE
TEACHERS' AND STATE EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM OR THE
LOCAL GOVERNMENTAL EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM TO
RETIRE WITH UNREDUCED BENEFITS AFTER COMPLETING TWENTYFIVE YEARS OF SERVICE.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:



Section 1. G.S. 135-5(b13) reads as rewritten:

"(b13) Service Retirement Allowance of Members Retiring on or after July 1, 1992.1992, but before July 1, 1993. – Upon retirement from service in accordance with subsection (a) above, on or after July 1, 1992, but before July 1, 1993, a member shall receive the following service retirement allowance:

- (1) A member who is a law enforcement officer or an eligible former law enforcement officer shall receive a service retirement allowance computed as follows:
 - a. If the member's service retirement date occurs on or after his 65th birthday, and completion of five years of creditable service as a law enforcement officer, or after the completion of 30 years of creditable service, the allowance shall be equal to one and seventy hundredths percent (1.70%) of his average final compensation, multiplied by the number of years of his creditable service
