2	AN ACT TO DELINEATE THE RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE DEPARTMENT OF
3	COMMERCE AND THE DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENT, HEALTH, AND
4	NATURAL RESOURCES REGARDING THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE
5	STATE'S RECYCLING INDUSTRY AND MARKETS FOR RECYCLABLE

7	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
8	Section 1. G.S. 130A-309.14(b) reads as rewritten:
9	"(b) The Department of Commerce shall assist and encourage the recycling
10	industry in the State. Assistance and encouragement of the recycling industry shall
11	include:
12	(1) Identifying and analyzing in coopration with the Department, Assisting the
13	Department in the identification and analysis, by the Department
14	pursuant to G.S. 130A-309.06, of components of the State's recycling
15	industry and present and potential markets for recyclable materials in
16	this State, other states, and foreign countries;
17	(2) Providing information on the availability and benefits of using
18	recycled materials to businesses and industries in the State, and
19	(3) Distributing any material prepared in implementing this section to the
20	public, businesses, industries, units of local government, or other
21	organizations upon request."
