A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

2 AN ACT TO PROVIDE THAT THE DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE MAY PROVIDE CRIMINAL RECORD CHECKS TO HOSPITALS AND OTHER HEALTH CARE 3 4 FACILITIES. 5 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: Section 1. Article 4 of Chapter 114 of the General Statutes is amended by 6 7 adding a new section to read: 8 "§ 114-19.3. Criminal record checks of personnel of hospitals and other health care 9 facilities. The Department of Justice may provide a criminal record check to hospitals 10 (a) and other health care facilities licensed under Chapters 131E and 122C of the General 11 Statutes, including to contract health care agencies of area mental health, developmental 12 disabilities, and substance abuse authority that are subject to the provisions of Article 4 13 of Chapter 122C of the General Statutes, of a person who is employed by the area 14 authority or of a person who has applied for employment if the employee or applicant 15 consents to the record check. The information shall be kept confidential by the hospital 16 or other health care facility. 17 18 The Department of Justice shall charge a reasonable fee for conducting a (b)criminal record check under this section. The fee shall not exceed the actual cost of 19 locating, editing, researching, and retrieving the information. 20 The Department of Justice shall adopt rules to implement this section." 21 (c) 22 Sec. 2. This act is effective upon ratification.
