The plate shall bear the operator's official Class D citizen's radio station call letters. 4 5 Clerk of Superior Court. – Issuable to a clerk of superior court. The (5) 6 plate shall bear the phrase 'Clerk Superior Court' and the letter 'C' 7 followed by a number that indicates the county the clerk serves. 8 Coast Guard Auxiliary Member. – Issuable to an active member of the (6) 9 United States Coast Guard Auxiliary. The plate shall bear the phrase 10 'Coast Guard Auxiliary'. Collegiate Insignia Plate. – Issuable to the registered owner of a motor 11 (6a) vehicle in accordance with G.S. 20-81.12. The plate may bear a phrase 12 13 or an insignia representing a public or private college or university. 14 (7) Congressional Medal of Honor Recipient. – Issuable to a recipient of 15 the Congressional Medal of Honor. 16 County Commissioners. – Issuable to a county commissioner. The (7a) 17 plate shall bear the words 'County Commissioner' followed by the 18 number that indicates the county that the applicant serves, in the alphabetical list of counties, and a letter or number to distinguish 19 20 different cars owned by the county commissioners in that county. 21 (8) Disabled Veteran. – Issuable to a veteran of the armed forces of the United States who suffered a 100% service-connected disability. 22 (9) District Attorney. - Issuable to a North Carolina or United States 23 24 District Attorney. The plate issuable to a North Carolina district attorney shall bear the letters 'DA' followed by a number that 25 represents the prosecutorial district the district attorney serves. The 26 27 plate for a United States attorney shall bear the phrase 'U.S. Attorney' followed by a number that represents the district the attorney serves, 28 29 with 1 being the Eastern District, 2 being the Middle District, and 3 30 being the Western District. 31 (10)Fire Department or Rescue Squad Member. – Issuable to an active 32 regular member or volunteer member of a fire department, rescue squad, or both a fire department and rescue squad. The plate shall bear 33 34 the words 'Firefighter', 'Rescue Squad', or 'Firefighter-Rescue Squad'. 35 (11)Historic Vehicle Owner. – Issuable for a motor vehicle that is at least 35 years old measured from the date of manufacture. The plate for a 36 vehicle that is 35 to 50 years old shall bear the phrase 'Antique'. The 37 38 plate for a vehicle that is at least 50 years old shall bear the phrase 39 'Horseless Carriage'.

Historical Attraction Plate. – Issuable to the registered owner of a

motor vehicle in accordance with G.S. 20-81.12. The plate may

bear a phrase or an insignia representing a publicly owned or

nonprofit historical attraction located in North Carolina.

(12)Honorary Plate. – Issuable to a member of the Honorary Consulor 1 2 Consular Corps, who has been certified by the U. S. State 3 Department, the plate shall bear the words 'Honorary Consulor Consular Corps' and a distinguishing number based on the order of 4 5 issuance 6 (13)Judge or Justice. – Issuable to a sitting or retired judge or justice in 7 accordance with G.S. 20-79.6. 8 (14)Legislator. – Issuable to a member of the North Carolina General 9 Assembly. The plate shall bear the words 'Senate' or 'State House' 10 followed by the Senator's or Representative's assigned seat number. (15)Marshal. – Issuable to a United States Marshal. The plate shall bear 11 12 the phrase 'U.S. Marshal' followed by a number that represents the district the Marshal serves, with 1 being the Eastern District, 2 13 14 being the Middle District, and 3 being the Western District. (16)15 Military Reservist. – Issuable to a member of a reserve component 16 of the armed forces of the United States. The plate shall bear the 17 name and insignia of the appropriate reserve component. Plates 18 shall be numbered sequentially for members of a component with 19 the numbers 1 through 5000 reserved for officers, without regard to 20 rank. 21 (16a)Military Retiree. – Issuable to an individual who has retired from 22 the armed forces of the United States. The plate shall bear the 23 phrase 'U.S. Armed Forces Retired' and the name of the branch of 24 service from which the individual retired. National Guard Member. - Issuable to an active or a retired 25 (17)member of the North Carolina National Guard. The plate shall bear 26 27 the phrase 'National Guard'. A plate issued to an active member shall bear a number that reflects the seniority of the member; a 28 29 plate issued to a commissioned officer shall begin with the number 30 '1'; a plate issued to a noncommissioned officer with a rank of E7, E8, or E9 shall begin with the number '1601'; a plate issued to an 31 32 enlisted member with a rank of E6 or below shall begin with the 33 number '3001'. The plate issued to a retired or separated member shall indicate the member's retired status. 34 35 (18)Partially Disabled Veteran. – Issuable to a veteran of the armed forces of the United States who suffered a service connected 36 disability of less than 100%. 37 38 (19)Pearl Harbor Survivor. – Issuable to a veteran of the armed forces 39 of the United States who was present at and survived the attack on 40 Pearl Harbor on December 7, 1941. The plate will bear the phrase 41 'Pearl Harbor Survivor' and the insignia of the Pearl Harbor 42 Survivors' Association. Personalized. – Issuable to the registered owner of a motor vehicle. 43 (20)
