1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO PROVIDE IMMUNITY FOR EMPLOYEES OF COUNTY DEPARTMENTS OF SOCIAL SERVICES.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. G.S. 7A-550 reads as rewritten:

# "§ 7A-550. Immunity of persons reporting. reporting; immunity of Department of Social Services employees.

- (a) Anyone who makes a report pursuant to this Article, cooperates with the county department of social services in any ensuing inquiry or investigation, testifies in any judicial proceeding resulting from the report, or otherwise participates in the program authorized by this Article, is immune from any civil or criminal liability that might otherwise be incurred or imposed for such action provided that the person was acting in good faith. In any proceeding involving liability, good faith is presumed.
- (b) Any employee of a county department of social services who is assigned to perform, on behalf of the Director of that department, any of the duties permitted or required by this Article, or who takes a juvenile into temporary custody pursuant to G.S. 7A-571(3), shall be personally and individually immune from any civil liability for monetary damages which might otherwise be incurred or imposed for any act or failure to act by the employee with respect to those duties, except where the employee was not acting in good faith or committed gross negligence or willful or wanton misconduct that resulted in the damage or injury. In any proceeding involving liability, good faith on the part of the employee shall be presumed."
- Sec. 2. This act is effective upon ratification but does not apply to litigation pending on the effective date.
