2	AN ACT TO IMPLEMENT A RECOMMENDATION OF THE GOVERNMENT
3	PERFORMANCE AUDIT COMMITTEE TO CONSOLIDATE THE
4	ADMINISTRATION OF THE STATE'S WORKERS' COMPENSATION
5	PROGRAM AND TO CREATE THE STATE GOVERNMENT WORKERS'
6	COMPENSATION OFFICE.
7	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
8	Section 1. Chapter 143 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new
9	Article to read:
10	'' <u>ARTICLE 64.</u>
11	"STATE GOVERNMENT WORKERS' COMPENSATION OFFICE.
12	"§ 143-590. State Government Workers' Compensation Office established;
13	administration; appointment, compensation and tenure of Director.
14	There is hereby established the State Government Workers' Compensation Office
15	(hereinafter referred to as 'Office') which shall be placed for organizational purposes
16	within the Department of Administration. Notwithstanding any other provision of law,
17	the Office shall be under the administrative supervision of a Director appointed by the
18	Governor. The salary of the Director shall be fixed by the General Assembly in the
19	Current Operations Appropriations Act. The Director shall serve at the pleasure of the
20	Governor.
21	"§ 143-591. Functions of the State Government Workers' Compensation Office;

1	(a) The State Government Workers' Compensation Office shall administer the
2	State workers' compensation program in accordance with rules and procedures to be
3	adopted by the Office, including rules and procedures related to the following:
4	(1) Processing all State government employee claims; including
5	employees in the judicial, legislative, and executive branches of
6	government and all public school employees paid from State funds;
7	(2) <u>Authorizing payment of benefits to employees pursuant to the</u> Worksond Commensation Act and the pulse and regulations of the North
8	Workers' Compensation Act and the rules and regulations of the North
9	(2) <u>Carolina Industrial Commission; and</u>
10 11	(3) <u>Settling workers' compensation claims made against the State.</u> (b) The Workers' Compensation Office shall collect all money ewod to the State
11	(b) The Workers' Compensation Office shall collect all money owed to the State as a result of the subrogation of third-party claims pursuant to G.S. 97-10.2 and
12	reimburse the appropriate State department, agency, or institution for benefits paid to
13	employees.
14	(c) <u>The Attorney General shall assign counsel to the State Government Workers</u>
16	<u>Compensation Office to represent the State in connection with claims asserted against</u>
17	the State pursuant to Chapter 97 of the General Statutes."
18	Sec. 2. (a) The State Government Workers' Compensation Office (hereinafter
19	referred to as "Office") shall complete a review of the following:
20	(1) Whether there should be established a reserve fund from which to
21	disburse payments for workers' compensation claims regardless of the
22	processing method elected by the State.
23	(2) The extent of the unfunded liability that exists on current open claims
24	so that State agencies may be held accountable for expenditures based
25	on claims experience-rating factors.
26	(3) The allocation process for funding workers' compensation
27	expenditures.
28	(4) Whether State agencies should be required to either reserve or
29	encumber funds to pay workers' compensation claims based on prior
30	expenditures plus anticipated increases.
31	(b) The Office shall complete the review required in subsection (a) of this
32	section by May 1, 1994. The Office shall report its findings and any recommendations
33	to the General Assembly on or before the first day of the 1994 General Assembly by
34	filing the report and any recommendations with the Speaker of the House of
35	Representatives, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, the Joint Legislative
36	Commission on Governmental Operations, and the Fiscal Research Division.
37	Sec. 3. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of
38 39	Administration the sum of nine hundred four thousand seven hundred seventy-one dollars (\$004.771) for fixed year 1002.04 and the sum of nine hundred four thousand
39 40	dollars (\$904,771) for fiscal year 1993-94 and the sum of nine hundred four thousand seven hundred seventy-one dollars (\$904,771) for fiscal year 1994-95 to establish 33
