4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
5	Section 1. The title of G.S. 130A-309.10 reads as rewritten:
6	"§ 130A-309.10. Prohibited acts relating to packaging; coded labeling of plastic
7	containers required; disposal of certain special <u>solid</u> wastes in landfills <u>or</u>
8	by incineration prohibited."
9	Sec. 2. G.S. 130A-309.10(f) reads as rewritten:
10	"(f) In accordance with the following schedule, no person shall knowingly
11	dispose of the following special wastes in landfills:
12	(1) Repealed by Session Laws 1991, c. 375, s. 1.
13	(2) Used oil, after 1 October 1990.
14	(3) Yard trash, after 1 January 1993, except in landfills classified for such
15	use under rules adopted by the Commission. Yard trash that is source
16	separated from solid waste may be accepted at a solid waste disposal
17	area where the area provides and maintains separate yard trash
18	composting facilities.
19	(4) White goods, after 1 January 1991.
20	(5) <u>Antifreeze (ethylene glycol).</u>
21	(6) <u>Aluminum cans.</u> "
22	Sec. 3. G.S. 130A-309.10 is amended by adding a new subsection following
23	subsection (f) to read:

1	"(f1) In accordance with the following schedule, no person shall knowingly
2	dispose of the following solid wastes by incineration in an incinerator for which a
3	permit is required under this Article:
4	(1) <u>Antifreeze (ethylene glycol).</u>
5	(2) <u>Aluminum cans.</u>
6	(3) Steel cans, unless the steel is recoverable at the end of the incineration
7	process.
8	(4) White goods."
9	Sec. 4. This act becomes effective October 1, 1993.
