Sec. 4. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Judicial Department the sum of two hundred thirty-one thousand three hundred thirty-four dollars (\$231,334) for the 1994-95 fiscal year to continue funding the Mecklenburg County Drug Court program during the fourth quarter of the 1994-95 fiscal year. The Governor's Crime Commission grant supporting this program expires March 31, 1995.

Sec. 5. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Correction the sum of eight thousand seven hundred fifty dollars (\$8,750) for the 1994-
