5	Section 1. G.S. 8-50.2 reads as rewritten:

12	a radio microwave microwave, laser, or other electronic speed-measuring instrument are			
13	not admissible in any proceeding unless it is found that:			
14		The operator of the instrument held, at the time the results of the		
15		speed-measuring instrument were obtained, a certificate from the		
16		North Carolina Criminal Justice Education and Training Standards		
17		Commission (hereinafter referred to as the Commission) authorizing		
18		him to operate the speed-measuring instrument from which the results		
19		were obtained.		
20		The operator of the instrument operated the speed-measuring		
21		instrument in accordance with the procedures established by the		
22		Commission for the operation of such instrument.

(3) The instrument employed was approved for use by the Commission 1 2 and the Secretary of Crime Control and Public Safety pursuant to G.S. 3 17C-6. 4 (4) The speed-measuring instrument had been calibrated and tested for 5 accuracy in accordance with the standards established by the 6 Commission for that particular instrument. 7 All radio microwave and other electronic speed-measuring instruments shall (c) 8 be tested for accuracy by a technician possessing at least a second-class or general 9 radiotelephone license from the Federal Communications Commission or a certification 10 issued by organizations or committees endorsed by the Federal Communications Commission within a period of 12 months prior to the alleged violation. A written 11 12 certificate by such technician showing that the test was made within the required period 13 and that the instrument was accurate shall be competent and prima facie evidence of 14 those facts in any proceeding referred to in subsection (a) of this section. 15 All laser speed enforcement instruments shall be tested in accordance with standards 16 established by the Commission. The Commission shall provide for certification of laser 17 speed enforcement instruments. A written certificate by a technician certified by the 18 Commission showing that a test was made within the required testing period and that the instrument was accurate shall be competent and prima facie evidence of those facts 19 20 in any proceeding referred to in subsection (a) of this section. 21 (d)In every proceeding where the results of a radio microwave-microwave, laser, or other speed-measuring instrument is sought to be admitted, judicial notice shall be 22 23 taken of the rules approving the use of the models and types of radio microwave and other speed-measuring instruments and the procedures for operation and calibration or 24 25 measuring accuracy of such instruments." G.S. 17C-6(a) reads as rewritten: 26 27 In addition to powers conferred upon the Commission elsewhere in this "(a) 28 Chapter, the Commission shall have the following powers, which shall be enforceable 29 through its rules and regulations, certification procedures, or the provisions of G.S. 17C-30 10: 31 (1)Promulgate rules and regulations for the administration of this Chapter, which rules may require (i) the submission by any criminal 32 33 justice agency of information with respect to the employment, 34 education, retention, and training of its criminal justice officers, and 35 (ii) the submission by any criminal justice training school of information with respect to its criminal justice training programs that 36 37 are required by this Chapter; 38 (2)Establish minimum educational and training standards that must be 39 met in order to qualify for entry level employment and retention as a 40 criminal justice officer in temporary or probationary status or in a permanent position; 41 42 (3) Certify, pursuant to the standards that it has established for the purpose, persons as qualified under the provisions of this Chapter to be 43 44 employed at entry level and retained as criminal justice officers;
