A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT TO TRANSFER MOORE COUNTY TO JUDICIAL AND
PROSECUTORIAL DISTRICTS 19B.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. (a) G.S. 7A-41(a) reads as rewritten:

"(a) The counties of the State are organized into judicial divisions and superior court districts, and each superior court district has the counties, and the number of regular resident superior court judges set forth in the following table, and for districts of less than a whole county, as set out in subsection (b) of this section:

 19 filled by the superior court judge from current District 20A who resides in Moore
 20 County. The term of that judge expires December 31, 2000. That judge's successor shall
 21 be elected in the 2000 general election.

1 (b) The three assistant district attorney positions created for District 19B shall be
2 filled by three assistant district attorneys currently serving Moore County in District 20.

3 Sec. 4. Sections 1, 2, and 3 of this act become effective October 1, 1995, or
4 the date upon which those sections are approved under section 5 of the Voting Rights Act
5 of 1965, whichever is later. The remainder of this act is effective upon ratification.
