A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR THE STATE OF NORTH CAROLINA TO ESTABLISH A STATE VETERANS HOME PROGRAM IN THE DIVISION OF VETERANS AFFAIRS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF ADMINISTRATION.

AFFAIRS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF ADMINISTRATION. Whereas, there are more than 700,000 veterans in North Carolina, of whom more than 200,000 are 65 years of age or older, with the percentage of older veterans projected to grow significantly in the future; and

Whereas, the General Assembly authorized the Veterans Home Study Commission to conduct an independent study to determine the feasibility of constructing a State Veterans Home which, after due consideration, determined that the construction of a home was not only feasible, but also necessary because of the aging veteran population; and

Whereas, a study commissioned by the 1992 General Assembly concurred with the results of the study conducted by the Veterans Home Study Commission in projecting the need for a skilled nursing care bed State Veterans Home on a site adjacent to the Fayetteville Veterans Administration Medical Center; and

Whereas, the General Assembly finds and determines that there currently exists a significant need for health, nursing, and medical rehabilitative facilities for those residents of this State who have served their State and nation in the Armed Forces; and

	Whereas, the General Assembly further finds and determines that to meet this need there should be established a State Veterans Home program to provide nursing home care to
	veterans who are residents of North Carolina; Now, therefore,
1	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
2	Section 1. Chapter 165 of the General Statutes is amended by adding the
3	following new Article to read:

5	<u>"STATE VETERANS HOME.</u>

7	This Article may be referred to as the 'State Veterans Home Act'.
8	"§ 165-46. Establishment.
9	The State of North Carolina shall construct, maintain, and operate veterans homes for
10	the aged and infirm veterans resident in this State under the administrative authority and
11	control of the Division of Veterans Affairs of the Department of Administration. There is
12	vested in such Division any and all powers and authority that may be necessary to enable
13	it to establish and operate the homes and to issue rules necessary to operate the homes in
14	compliance with applicable State and federal statutes and regulations.
15	" <u>§ 165-47. Exemption from certificate of need.</u>
16	Any state veterans home established by the Division of Veterans Affairs shall be
17	exempt form the certificate of need requirements as set out in Article 9 of Chapter 131E,
18	or as may be hereinafter enacted.
19	" <u>§ 165-48. North Carolina Veterans Home Trust Fund.</u>
20	(a) Establishment. – A trust fund shall be established in the State treasury, for the
21	Division of Veterans Affairs, to be known as the North Carolina Veterans Home Trust
22	<u>Fund.</u>
23	(b) Composition. – The trust fund shall consist of all funds and monies received by
24	the Veterans Affairs Commission or the Division of Veterans Affairs from the United
25	States, any federal agency or institution, and any other source, whether as a grant,
26	appropriation, gift, contribution, bequest or individual reimbursement, for the care and
27	support of veterans who have been admitted to a State veterans home.
28	(c) Use of Fund. – The trust fund created in subsection (a) of this section shall be
29	used by the Division of Veterans Affairs:
30	(1) <u>To pay for the care of veterans in said State veterans homes:</u>
31	(2) To pay the general operating expenses of the State veterans homes,
32	including the payment of salaries and wages of officials and employees
33	of said homes; and
34	(3) <u>To remodel, repair, construct, modernize, or add improvements to</u>
35	buildings and facilities at the homes.
36	(d) <u>Miscellaneous. – The following provisions apply to the trust fund created in</u>
37	subsection (a) of this section:
38	(1) <u>All funds deposited and all income earned on the investment or</u>
39	reinvestment of such funds shall be credited to the trust fund.

1	<u>(2)</u>	Any monies remaining in the trust fund at the end of each fiscal year
2		shall remain on deposit in the State treasury to the credit of the North
3		Carolina Veterans Home Trust Fund.
4	<u>(3)</u>	Nothing contained herein shall prohibit the establishment and utilization
5		of special agency accounts by the Division of Veterans Affairs, as may
6		be approved by the Veterans Affairs Commission, for the receipt and
7		disbursement of personal funds of the State veterans homes' residents or
8		for receipt and disbursement of charitable contributions for use by and
9		for residents.
