| 6 | Section 1. Section 6 of Chapter 99 of the Private Laws of 1911, as rewritten by |
| 7 | Chapter 226 of the Session Laws of 1967, is rewritten to read: |
| 8 | "Sec. 6. (a) The Mayor shall be elected in 1997 and biennially thereafter for a |
| 9 | four-year term. |
| 10 | (b) In 1997, four members of the Board of Commissioners shall be elected. The |
| 11 | two persons receiving the highest numbers of votes are elected for four-year terms, and |
| 12 | the two persons receiving the next highest numbers of votes are elected to two-year |
| 13 | terms. In 1999 and biennially thereafter, two members of the Board of Commissioners |
| 14 | are elected for four-year terms. |
| 15 | (c) Elections in the Town of Lumber Bridge shall be elected in accordance with |
| 16 | general law." |
| 17 | Sec. 2. This act is effective upon ratification. |
