S 1 SENATE BILL 147 Short Title: Monitor Effects of Pesticide Use. (Public) Sponsors: Senators Jordan; and Carpenter. Referred to: Agriculture/Environment/Natural Resources. February 7, 1995 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT TO REQUIRE THE DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENT, HEALTH, AND NATURAL RESOURCES TO DEVELOP A PROGRAM TO MONITOR THE ENVIRONMENTAL AND BIOLOGICAL EFFECTS OF PESTICIDE USE AND PREPARE AN ANNUAL REPORT OF PESTICIDE-RELATED ILLNESSES, INJURIES, AND DEATHS, AND TO MAKE CERTAIN **TECHNICAL** CORRECTIONS. The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: Section 1. G.S. 143-437 reads as rewritten: "§ 143-437. Pesticide Board; functions. The Pesticide Board shall be the governing board for the programs of pesticide management and control set forth in this Article. The Pesticide Board shall have the following powers and duties under this Articleshall: To adopt Adopt rules and regulations and make policies for the programs (1) set forth in this Article. To carry out a program of planning, environmental and biological (2) monitoring, and of investigation into long range needs and problems concerning pesticides. (3) To collect, Collect, analyze and disseminate information necessary for

the effective operation of the programs set forth in this Article.
