- (2) In connection with any delinquency proceeding under Article 30 of this Chapter, for the purpose of locating and recovering the assets of or any other obligations or liabilities owed to or due an insurer that has been placed under such proceeding.
- In connection with any civil litigation, other than under Chapter 150B of the General Statutes or any appeal from an order of the Commissioner or his deputies, that is commenced against the Commissioner or his deputies and that arises out of the performance of their official duties, for the purpose of retaining outside consultants, legal counsel, and court reporting services to defend such litigation.

All moneys received by the State in recoveries made under subdivision (2) of this subsection or in counterclaims or lawsuits filed by the State in connection with any litigation under subdivision (3) of this subsection shall be credited to the Fund."

Sec. 2. This act is effective upon ratification.
