4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
5	Section 1. Article 21 of Chapter 143 of the General Statutes is amended by
6	adding a new Part to read:
7	"PART 9A. APPLICATION OF AGRICULTURAL BY-PRODUCTS.
8	" <u>§ 143-215.74C.1. Title.</u>
9	This Part is the 'Application of Agricultural By-Products Act'.
10	" <u>§ 143-215.74C.2. Purpose.</u>
11	The purpose of this Part is to reduce nonpoint source pollution in order to protect the
12	public health and to conserve and protect the quality of the State's water resources and to
13	encourage the development and improvement of the State's agricultural land for the
14	production of food and other agricultural products.
15	" <u>§ 143-215.74C.3. Definitions.</u>

1	<u>(1)</u>	'Agricultural by-product' means animal residuals resulting from the
2		raising of swine.
3	<u>(2)</u>	'Application' means application through laying, spreading on, irrigating,
4		or injecting.
5	<u>(3)</u>	'Operator' means the person who owns or controls the land used for
6		agricultural purposes or the person's lessee or designee.
7	<u>(4)</u>	'Operator in charge' means a person who holds a currently valid
8		certificate to operate an agricultural by-products control systems and
9		who has primary responsibility for the operation of the system.
10	" <u>§ 143-215.74C</u>	.4. Agricultural by-products management required.
11	<u>Agricultural</u>	by-products subject to this Part shall be managed so that the land
12	application of the	hose by-products does not cause a discharge of pollutants to the surface
13	waters of the St	tate, except as a result of a storm event more severe than a 25-year, 24-
14	<u>hour storm.</u>

16	<u>(a)</u> Begin	ning January 1, 1997, only an operator in charge or a person under his or
17	her supervision	may apply the agricultural by-products resulting from swine production
18	to the land. T	The owner or other person in control of the land used for the swine
19	production is re	sponsible for ensuring that the application is performed by an operator in
20	charge.	
21	<u>(b)</u> <u>This I</u>	Part applies only to owners of land or other operators with agricultural by-
22	products manag	ement systems designed to manage more than 250 swine. This Part is not
23	intended to supp	plant any permit otherwise required to be obtained from the Department
24	for the discharge	e of an agricultural by-product.
25	" <u>§ 143-215.74</u>	C.6. Qualifications for operators of agricultural by-products
26	mana	gement systems; issuance of certificates.
27	<u>(a)</u> The E	Department of Agriculture shall issue a certificate as an operator in charge
28	to a person who	completes the instructional requirements under subsection (b) and pays a
29	ten dollar (\$10.	00) fee. No examination or other requirement may be imposed on the
30	applicant as a co	ondition of certification.
31	(b) Each	applicant shall complete six hours of instruction on the operation of
32	agricultural by	-products management systems. The North Carolina Agricultural
33	Extension Serv	ice shall provide the instruction. The instructional program shall be
34	developed by th	e Agricultural Extension Service in conjunction with the Department of
35		ealth, and Natural Resources."
