A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT TO ALLOW THE ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE CONTROL COMMISSION
TO ISSUE PERMITS FOR "BREW ON PREMISES" BUSINESSES.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. G.S. 18B-307 reads as rewritten:

"§ 18B-307. Manufacturing offenses.

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- (a) Offenses. It shall be unlawful for any person, except as authorized by this Chapter, to:
 - (1) Sell or possess equipment or ingredients intended for use in the manufacture of any alcoholic beverage; beverage, except equipment and ingredients provided under a Brew on Premises permit; or
 - (2) Knowingly allow real or personal property owned or possessed by him to be used by another person for the manufacture of any alcoholic beverage, except pursuant to a Brew on Premises permit.
- (b) Unlawful Manufacturing. Except as provided in G.S. 18B- 306, it shall be unlawful for any person to manufacture any alcoholic beverage beverage, except at an establishment with a Brew on Premises permit, without first obtaining the applicable ABC permit and revenue licenses.
