1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT TO PROVIDE THAT CERTAIN STUDENTS WHO DROP OUT OF
3	SCHOOL OR DO NOT MAKE PROGRESS TOWARD GRADUATION SHALL
4	NOT BE ELIGIBLE FOR DRIVERS PERMITS OR LICENSES.
5	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
6	Section 1. G.S. 20-11, as amended by Chapter 16 of the 1997 Session Laws,
7	reads as rewritten:
8	"§ 20-11. Issuance of limited learner's permit and provisional drivers license to
9	person who is less than 18 years old.
10	(a) Process. – Safe driving requires instruction in driving and experience. To
11	ensure that a person who is less than 18 years old has both instruction and experience
12	before obtaining a drivers license, driving privileges are granted first on a limited basis
13	and are then expanded in accordance with the following process:
14	(1) Level 1. – Driving with a limited learner's permit.
15	(2) Level 2. – Driving with a limited provisional license.
16	(3) Level 3. – Driving with a full provisional license.

13	(1)	The permit holder must be in possession of the permit.
14	(2)	A supervising driver must be seated beside the permit holder in the front
15		seat of the vehicle when it is in motion. No person other than the
16		supervising driver can be in the front seat.
17	(3)	For the first six months after issuance, the permit holder may drive only
18		between the hours of 5:00 a.m. and 9:00 p.m.
19	(4)	After the first six months after issuance, the permit holder may drive at
20		any time.
21	(5)	Every person occupying the vehicle being driven by the permit holder
22		must have a safety belt properly fastened about his or her body, or be
23		restrained by a child passenger restraint system as provided in G.S. 20-
24		137.1(a), when the vehicle is in motion.
25	(d) Lev	rel 2. – A person who is at least 16 years old but less than 18 years old may
26	obtain a limite	ed provisional license if the person meets all of the following requirements:
27	(1)	Has held a limited learner's permit issued by the Division for at least 12
28		months.
29	(2)	Has not been convicted of a motor vehicle moving violation or seat belt
30		infraction during the preceding six months.
31	(3)	Passes a road test administered by the Division.

8		occupant of the front seat, but must be the person seated next to the
9		license holder.

11		must have a safety belt properly fastened about his or her body, or be
12		restrained by a child passenger restraint system as provided in G.S. 20-
13		137.1(a), when the vehicle is in motion.

26		of-State Exceptions A person who is at least 16 years old but less than
27		ho was a resident of another state and has an unrestricted drivers license
28	issued by that	state, and who becomes a resident of this State may obtain one of the
29		wing upon the submission of a driving eligibility certificate or a high
30		or its equivalent:
31	(1)	A temporary permit, if the person has not completed a drivers education
32		program that meets the requirements of the Superintendent of Public
33		Instruction but is currently enrolled in a drivers education program that
34		meets these requirements. A temporary permit is valid for the period
35		specified in the permit and authorizes the holder of the permit to drive a
36		specified type or class of motor vehicle when in possession of the
37		permit, subject to any restrictions imposed by the Division concerning
38		time of driving, supervision, and passenger limitations. The period
39		must end within 10 days after the expected completion date of the
40		drivers education program in which the applicant is enrolled.
41	(2)	A full provisional license, if the person has completed a drivers
42		education program that meets the requirements of the Superintendent of
43		Public Instruction, has held the license issued by the other state for at

21	dollars (\$10.00).	The fee for a full provisional license is the amount set under G.S. 20-

11	Section 2. G.S. 20-13.2 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:
12	"(c1) The Division must revoke the permit or license of a person under the age of 18
13	if the proper school authority notifies the Division that the person has quit school.
14	Notwithstanding subsection (d) of this section, the length of revocation will be at least 90
15	days and may last until the person's eighteenth birthday. The Division may restore a
16	person's permit or license after the initial 90-day period, and before the person's
17	eighteenth birthday, if the person submits to the Division one of the following:
18	(1) <u>A high school diploma or its equivalent.</u>
19	(2) <u>A driving eligibility certificate as required under G.S. 20-11(n)</u> ."
20	Section 3. G.S. 115C-12 is amended by adding a new subdivision to read:
21	"(26) Duty to Develop Rules for Issuance of Driving Eligibility Certificates. –
22	The State Board of Education shall issue rules defining what is
22 23	equivalent to a high school diploma for the purposes of G.S. 20-11. It
24	shall also issue rules for the procedures a person must follow and the
25	requirements a person must meet to obtain a driving eligibility
26	certificate. A person must be given a driving eligibility certificate if the
27	person is making progress towards obtaining a high school diploma or
28	its equivalent. A person may be given a driving eligibility certificate in
29	either one of the following circumstances:
30	a. If a hardship would be placed on the person or the person's
31	family if the person did not receive the certificate.
32	b. If it is determined that the person cannot make progress towards
33	obtaining a high school diploma.
34	Rules adopted under this subdivision shall not apply to nonpublic
35	schools not accredited by the State Board. The rules shall provide for
36	an appeal to an appropriate education authority by a person who is
37	denied a driving eligibility certificate."
38	Section 4. The State Board of Education, in collaboration with the Office of
39	Non-Public Education in the Office of the Governor and with the State Board of
40	Community Colleges, shall develop policies directing the appropriate education
41	authorities to notify the Division of Motor Vehicles whenever a student under the age of

42 18 quits school before obtaining a high school diploma or its equivalent.

1 Section 5. The State Board of Education shall study the effectiveness of this 2 act on the dropout rates and progress toward graduation of students under the age of 18 3 and shall report the results of the study to the 2000 Session of the General Assembly by 4 filing a copy of a report with the Speaker of the House of Representatives, with the 5 President Pro Tempore of the Senate, and with the Fiscal Research Division prior to the 6 first day of that legislative session.

Section 6. Sections 1 and 2 of this act become effective August 1, 1998. The
remainder of this act is effective when it becomes law. The rules required by Section 3 of
this act shall be issued by the State Board of Education no later than March 1, 1998.
