1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT TO LINK PAY RAISES FOR SUBSTITUTE TEACHERS TO PAY RAISES
3	FOR TEACHERS.
4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
5	Section 1. G.S. 115C-12(8) reads as rewritten:
6	"(8) Power to Make Provisions for Sick Leave and for Substitute Teachers. –
7	The Board shall provide for sick leave with pay for all public school
8	employees in accordance with the provisions of this Chapter and shall
9	promulgate rules and regulations providing for necessary substitutes on
10	account of sick leave and other teacher absences.
11	The pay for a substitute shall be fixed by the Board. A substitute teacher
12	shall be paid at the daily pay rate of a teacher with no years of
13	experience who is paid on the 'A' certificate salary schedule.
14	If a teacher assistant acts as a substitute teacher, the salary of the
15	teacher assistant for the day shall be the same as the daily salary of an
16	entry-level teacher with an 'A' certificate.
17	The Board may provide to each local school administrative unit not
18	exceeding one percent (1%) of the cost of instructional services for the

1	purpose of providing substitute teachers for those on sick leave as
2	authorized by law or by regulations of the Board, but not exceeding the
3	provisions made for other State employees."
4	Section 2. There is appropriated from the General Fund to State Aid to Local
5	School Administrative Units the sum of ten million five hundred twenty-seven thousand
5	nine hundred twelve dollars (\$10,527,912) for the 1997-98 fiscal year and the sum of ten
7	million five hundred twenty-seven thousand nine hundred twelve dollars (\$10,527,912)
3	for the 1998-99 fiscal year to implement Section 1 of this act.
)	Section 3. This act becomes effective July 1, 1997.
