#### A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 AN ACT RELATING TO AUCTIONEERS.
- 3 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

4 Section 1. Chapter 114 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new section to read: 5

#### 6 "§ 114-19.6. Criminal record checks of auctioneer applicant.

The Department of Justice may provide to the North Carolina Auctioneers 7 Commission the criminal history from the State and National Repositories of Criminal 8 Histories. The Commission shall provide to the Department of Justice, along with the 9 request, the fingerprints of the applicant to be checked, any additional information 10 required by the Department of Justice, and a form consenting to the check of the criminal 11 record and to the use of fingerprints and other identifying information required by the 12 State or National Repositories signed by the applicant to be checked. The fingerprints of 13 the applicant shall be forwarded to the State Bureau of Investigation for a search of the 14 State's criminal history record file, and the State Bureau of Investigation shall forward a 15 set of fingerprints to the Federal Bureau of Investigation for a national criminal history 16 record check. The Commission shall keep all information pursuant to this section 17 privileged. The Department of Justice shall charge a reasonable fee only for conducting 18

the checks of the national criminal history records authorized by this section." 19

Section 2. G.S. 85B-4(b) reads as rewritten: 1 2 No person shall be licensed as an apprentice auctioneer, auctioneer, or receive "(b) 3 an auction firm license if the person: 4 Is under 18 years of age; (1)5 Repealed by Session Laws 1983, c. 751, s. 6. (2)6 (3) Has within the preceding five years pleaded guilty to, entered a plea of 7 nolo contendere or been convicted of any felony, or committed or been 8 convicted of any act involving fraud or moral turpitude; 9 (4) Has had an auctioneer or apprentice auctioneer or auction firm license 10 revoked; or Has, within the preceding five years, committed any act which 11 (5) 12 constitutes grounds for license suspension or revocation under this Chapter or a Commission rule.-rule; or 13 14 (6) Is not a high school graduate or passed the General Educational Development Test indicating high school equivalency." 15 Section 3. G.S. 85B-4(d) reads as rewritten: 16 17 "(d) No person shall be licensed as an auctioneer unless the person has held an 18 apprentice auctioneer license and served as an apprentice auctioneer for the two preceding years, accumulated sufficient knowledge and experience in such areas of the 19 20 auctioneer profession as the Commission may deem appropriate, and has taken an 21 examination approved by the Commission and performed on it to the satisfaction of the Commission. The examination shall test the applicant's understanding of the law relating 22 23 to auctioneers and auctions, ethical practices for auctioneers, the mathematics applicable 24 to the auctioneer business, and such other matters relating to auctions as the Commission considers appropriate. The examination shall be given at least twice each year in Raleigh, 25 and at other times and places the Commission designates, but no person shall be allowed 26 27 to take the examination within six months after having failed it a second time. Any person who has been in the auctioneer business in this State for at least two years 28 prior to the effective date of this act [July 1, 1973], and who makes proper application to 29 the Commission within one year after July 1, 1973, may be licensed as an auctioneer 30 without holding an apprentice license and serving as an apprentice of two years, and 31 without taking the examination required by this subsection. Any person who has 32 successfully completed the equivalent of at least 80 hours of classroom instruction in a 33

34 course in auctioneering at an institution approved by the <u>Commission Commission</u>,
 35 having instructors meeting the minimum qualifications established by the Commission,

36 may be licensed as an auctioneer without holding an apprentice license and serving as an 37 apprentice for two years, but must take the examination required by this subsection and 38 perform on it to the satisfaction of the Commission.

Each applicant for an auctioneer license shall submit a written application in a form approved by the Commission. If the applicant has been previously licensed as an apprentice auctioneer, the application shall contain an evaluation by the applicant's supervisor of the applicant's performance as an apprentice auctioneer and the applicant's performance in specific areas as required by the Commission. If the applicant is

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exempted from apprenticeship after completion of the equivalent of at least 80 hours of 1 2 classroom instruction in auctioneering, the application shall contain a transcript of the 3 applicant's course work in auctioneering. Each application shall be accompanied by 4 statements of at least two residents of the community in which the applicant resides 5 attesting to the applicant's good moral character. The Commission may require 6 verification of any information included in an application for an auctioneer license and may request other information or verification of information provided to determine 7 8 whether the applicant possesses the good moral character or other qualifications for 9 licensure."

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Section 4. G.S. 85B-4 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:

"(f1) The Commission may require licensees seeking renewal of a license under this 11 12 Chapter to complete Commission approved continuing education of not more than six hours per year per licensee as a condition precedent to renewal. The Commission may 13 14 impose different continuing education requirements, or none, upon the different classifications of licensees under this Chapter. The Commission shall be authorized to 15 waive the continuing education requirement in cases of hardship, disability, or illness or 16 17 under such other circumstances as the Commission deems appropriate. This subsection 18 shall apply to each renewal cycle which begins after the 1998-99 renewal."

19 Section 5. G.S. 85B-4.1 reads as rewritten:

## 20 "§ 85B-4.1. Auctioneer Recovery Fund.

"(a) In addition to license fees, upon application for a license or renewal of a
license, the Commission may charge the applicant or licensee up to fifty dollars (\$50.00)
per year to be included in the Fund.

(b) The Commission shall maintain at least <u>one-two</u> hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) (\$200,000) in the Fund for use as provided in this Chapter. The Fund may be invested by the State Treasurer in interest bearing accounts, and any interest accrued shall be added to the Fund. Sufficient liquidity shall be maintained to insure that funds will be available to satisfy claims processed through the Board. The Fund may be disbursed by a warrant drawn against the State Treasurer or by other method at the discretion of the State Treasurer.

31 (c) The Commission, in its discretion, may use contents of the Fund in excess of
 32 one-two hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) (\$200,000) for the following purposes:

- 33 To promote education and research in the auctioneer profession, in order (1)34 to benefit persons licensed under this Chapter and to improve the 35 efficiency of the profession; To underwrite educational seminars, training centers, and other forms of 36 (2)educational projects for the use and benefit of licensees; 37 To sponsor, contract for, or underwrite education and research projects 38 (3) 39 in order to advance the auctioneer profession in North Carolina; and
- 40 (4) To cooperate with associations of auctioneers, or other groups, in order
  41 to promote the enlightenment and advancement of the auctioneer
  42 profession in North Carolina."
- 43 Section 6. G.S. 85B-6(a) reads as rewritten:

30	Carolina or his representative, shall have concurrent jurisdiction with the district	ct

32	Section 8 This act is effective when it becomes law except that G.S. 85E	2

Section 8. This act is effective when it becomes law, except that G.S. 85B-4(b)(6) as enacted by this act does not apply to any person holding a license under Chapter 85B of the General Statutes on that date.

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
