February 27, 1997 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT TO REQUIRE ALL WASTEWATER SYSTEMS THAT MUST BE PERMITTED TO DISCHARGE WASTE TO HAVE AN ON-SITE GENERATOR. AS RECOMMENDED BY THE ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW COMMISSION. The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: Section 1. G.S. 143-215.1(b) is amended by adding a new subdivision to read: The Commission shall, as a condition of a permit, require wastewater "(5)systems, for which a permit for facilities discharging to the waters of the State is required, to have on-site a generator that is operated by a source of power other than electricity." Section 2. G.S. 143-215.1 is amended by adding a new subsection to read: "(h) Any wastewater system for which a permit for facilities discharging to the waters of the State is required shall not be operated unless a generator that is operated by a source of power other than electricity is maintained on-site." Section 3. By October 1, 1997, the Environmental Management Commission shall develop a schedule of dates after October 1, 1997, but not to extend beyond January

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Section 4. This act becomes effective October 1, 1997, and applies to those new wastewater systems and expansions of wastewater systems for which a discharge
