12	<u>(1)</u>	'Bicycle' means a human-powered vehicle with two wheels in tandem	
13		designed to transport, by the action of pedaling, one or more persons	
14		seated on one or more saddle seats on its frame. 'Bicycle' also includes	
15		a human-powered vehicle designed to transport, by action of pedaling,	
16		which has two wheels where the vehicle is used on a public roadway,	
17		public bicycle path, or other public right-of-way, but does not include a	
18		tricycle.	
19	<u>(2)</u>	'Operator' means a person who travels on a bicycle seated on a saddle	
20		seat from which that person is intended to and can pedal the bicycle.

1	<u>(3)</u>	'Other public right-of-way' means any right-of-way other than a public
2		roadway or public bicycle path that is under the jurisdiction and control
3		of this State or a local political subdivision of the State and is designed
4		for use and used by vehicular or pedestrian traffic.
5	<u>(4)</u>	'Passenger' means a person who travels on a bicycle in any manner
6		except as an operator.
7	<u>(5)</u>	'Protective bicycle helmet' means a piece of headgear which meets or
8		exceeds the impact standards for protective bicycle helmets set by the
9		American National Standards Institute (ANSI) or the Snell Memorial
10		Foundation.
11	<u>(6)</u>	'Public bicycle path' means a right-of-way under the jurisdiction and
12		control of this State or a local political subdivision of the State for use
13		primarily by bicycles or pedestrians.
14	<u>(7)</u>	'Public roadway' means a right-of-way under the jurisdiction and control
15		of this State or a local political subdivision of the State for use primarily
16		by motor vehicles.
17	<u>(8)</u>	'Restraining seat' means a seat separate from the saddle seat of the
18		operator of the bicycle that is fastened securely to the frame of the
19		bicycle and is adequately equipped to restrain the passenger in the seat
20		and to protect the passenger from the moving parts of the bicycle.
21	<u>(9)</u>	'Tricycle' means a three-wheeled, human-powered vehicle designed for
22		use as a toy by a single child under the age of six years, the seat of
23		which is no more than two feet from ground level.

27	<u>(1)</u>	It shall be unlawful for any person under the age of 16 to operate or be a
28		passenger on a bicycle unless at all times when the person is so engaged
29		he or she wears a protective bicycle helmet of good fit fastened securely
30		upon the head with the straps of the helmet.
31	<u>(2)</u>	It shall be unlawful for any person to be a passenger on a bicycle unless
32		all of the following conditions are met:
33		a. The person is able to maintain an erect, seated position on the
34		bicycle;
35		b. Except as provided in sub-subdivision c. of this subdivision, the
36		person is properly seated alone on a saddle seat (as on a tandem
37		bicycle); and
38		<u>c.</u> With respect to any person who weighs less than 40 pounds, or is
39		less than 40 inches in height, the person can be and is properly
40		seated in and adequately secured to a restraining seat.
41	<u>(3)</u>	It shall be unlawful for any parent or legal guardian of a person below
42		the age of 16 to knowingly permit that child to operate or be a passenger
43		on a bicycle in violation of subdivision (1) or (2) of this section.

1	<u>(4)</u>	It shall be unlawful to rent or lease any bicycle to or for the use of any	
2		person under the age of 16 unless:	
3		a. The person is in possession of a protective bicycle helmet of	
4		good fit at the time of the rental or lease; or	
5		b. The rental or lease includes a protective helmet of good fit, and	
6		the person intends to wear the helmet, as required by sub-	
7		subdivision a. of this subdivision, at all times while operating or	
8		being a passenger on the bicycle.	
9	<u>(5)</u>	No negligence or liability shall be assessed on or imputed to any party	
10		on account of violation of subdivision (1), (2), or (3) of this section.

12	<u>(a)</u> Except	ot as provided in subsection (b) of this section, any person violating any	
13	requirement set	forth in G.S. 20-171.8 shall have committed an infraction as defined in	
14	<u>G.S. 14-3.1</u> an	d may be ordered to pay a fine of up to ten dollars (\$10.00). The	
15	*	harging and trying the infraction is the same as for a misdemeanor, but	
16		n infraction has no consequence other than payment of a fine. A person	
17	convicted of an	infraction may not be assessed court costs.

24		this Part shall prohibit a unit of local government from adopting more
