5	Section 1.(a) There is established the Study Commission on Children With		
6	Special Needs. The Commission shall consist of 17 members, appointed as follows:		
7	(1) Seven persons appointed by the Speaker of the House of		
8	Representatives, four of whom shall be members of the House of		
9	Representatives, and three of whom shall be public members, as		
10	follows:		
11	a. One member representing The Arc of North Carolina;		
12	b. One member representing the Exceptional Children's Assistance		
13	Center; and		
14	c. One member representing Carolina Legal Assistance;		
15	(2) Seven persons appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate,		
16	four of whom shall be members of the Senate, and three of whom shall		
17	be public members, as follows:

18	Assembly may recommend proposed legislation.
