A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

2 AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY TO
3 ILLUMINATE THE NIGHTTIME DISPLAY OF THE UNITED STATES AND
4 NORTH CAROLINA FLAGS AT THE LEGISLATIVE BUILDING.

Whereas, North Carolinians are patriotic people who are devoted to their beloved State and country; and

Whereas, North Carolinians view the federal and State flags as symbols of freedom and democracy; and

Whereas, the citizens of this State are proud of the display of the federal and State flags; and

Whereas, neither flag is flown during darkness at the Legislative Building, the center of North Carolina's State government; and

Whereas, funds are needed to illuminate the federal and State flags during darkness; Now, therefore,

5 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

6 Section 1. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the General
7 Assembly the sum of four thousand eight hundred dollars (\$4,800) for the 2000-2001
8 fiscal year to allow for the illumination of both the federal and State flags at the
9 Legislative Building during darkness.

1 Section 2. This act becomes effective July 1, 2000.
