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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 AN ACT TO ANNEX TERRITORY TO THE TOWN OF NAVASSA.
- 3 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

4 Section 1. The corporate limits of the Town of Navassa are extended to 5 include the following described area:

Beginning at a point where the existing Town limits intersected at Mill Creek and Joe's 6 Slough (Chapter 77 of the 1977 Session Laws); Thence from the Beginning in a 7 northwest direction approximately 7,000 feet +- with the run of Mill Creek; To SR 1432 -8 Old Mill Road; Thence in a northwardly direction with the run of Rowel Branch a scaled 9 distance of 7,800 feet +- to intersection of SR 1426 - Mt. Misery Road; Thence with the 10 centerline of SR 1426 - Mt. Misery Road in a northwardly direction a scaled distance of 11 11,150 feet +-; To the intersection of SR 1428 - Dogwood Road; Thence with the 12 centerline of SR 1428 - Dogwood Road in a northwardly direction a scale distance of 13 4,000 feet +- to the property line intersection of E.I. Dupont DeNemours & Co. (Map 14 Book 8 - Page 74); Thence with Dupont Western Property line in a northeast direction a 15 scale distance of 11, 800 feet +-; To the Brunswick County Line in the centerline of the 16 Cape Fear River; Thence with the County Line (Cape Fear River) a southeasterly 17 direction a scaled distance of 57,300 feet +- to the intersection of Cape Fear River and 18 Davis Creek, the existing Town of Navassa City Limits; Thence with Davis Creek 19 (Navassa city existing limits) in a westerly direction a scale distance of 9,300 feet +- to 20

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- 1 Joe's Slough; Thence with Joe's Slough in a southerly direction a scaled distance of 7,000
- 2 feet +- to the Beginning and containing 8,300 acres plus or minus as by G. Douglas
- 3 Jeffreys, L1432, from a Brunswick County, State of North Carolina Quadrangle Map
- 4 produced by USGS.

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Section 2. This act becomes effective December 31, 2000.
