2	AN ACT RECLASSIFYING CERTIFIED CLINICAL SOCIAL WORKERS AS
3	LICENSED CLINICAL SOCIAL WORKERS AND REVISING THE FEES AND
4	QUALIFICATIONS FOR CERTIFICATION AND LICENSURE OF SOCIAL
5	WORKERS.
6	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
7	Section 1. Chapter 90B of the General Statutes reads as rewritten:
8	"CHAPTER 90B.
9	"SOCIAL WORKER CERTIFICATION AND LICENSURE ACT.
10	"§ 90B-1. Short title.
11	This Chapter shall be known as the "Social Worker Certification and Licensure Act.
12	"§ 90B-2. Purpose.
13	Since the profession of social work significantly affects the lives of the people of this
14	State, it is the purpose of this Chapter to protect the public by setting standards for
15	qualification, training training, and experience for those who seek to represent themselves
16	to the public as certified social workers or licensed clinical social workers and by
17	promoting high standards of professional performance for those engaged in the practice
18	of social work.

2	State Board of Education from practicing school social work under the title "Certified
3	School Social Worker." Except as provided for certified licensed clinical social workers,
4	nothing herein shall be construed as prohibiting social workers who are not certified by
5	the Board from practicing social work. Except as provided herein for eertified-licensed
6	clinical social workers, no agency, institution, board, commission, bureau, department,
7	division, council, member of the Council of State, or officer of the legislative, executive
8	or judicial branches of State government or counties, cities, towns, villages, other
9	municipal corporations, political subdivisions of the State, public authorities, private
10	corporations created by act of the General Assembly or any firm or corporation receiving
11	State funds shall require the obtaining or holding of any certificate issued under this
12	Chapter or the taking of an examination held pursuant to this Chapter as a requirement
13	for obtaining or continuing in employment.
14	(d) Nothing herein shall authorize the practice of medicine as defined in Article 1
15	of this Chapter or the practice of psychology as defined in Article 18A of this Chapter.
16	"§ 90B-5. North Carolina Certification Board for Social Work; <u>Social Work Licensure</u>
17	Board; appointments; terms; composition.
18	(a) For the purpose of carrying out the provisions of this Chapter, there is hereby
19	created the North Carolina Certification Board for Social Work Certification and Licensure
20	Board which shall consist of seven members appointed by the Governor as follows:
21	(1) At least two members of the Board shall be Certified Social Workers or
22	Certified Master Social Workers, three members shall be Certified
23	Licensed Clinical Social Workers, and two members shall be appointed
<u>-</u> 3 24	from the public at large. Composition of the Board as to the race and sex
25	of its members shall reflect the composition of the population of the
26	State of North Carolina.
27	(2) At all times the Board shall include at least one member primarily
28	engaged in social work education, at least one member primarily
29	engaged in social work in the public sector, and at least one member
30	primarily engaged in social work in the private sector.
31	(3) All members of the Board shall be residents of the State of North
32	Carolina, and with the exception of the public members, shall be
33	certified <u>or licensed</u> by the Board under the provisions of this Chapter.
34	Professional members of the Board must be actively engaged in the
35	practice of social work or in the education and training of students in
36	social work, and have been for at least three years prior to their
37	appointment to the Board. Such activity during the two years preceding
38	the appointment shall have occurred primarily in this State.
39	(b) The Governor may only remove a member of the Board for neglect of duty,
40	malfeasance, or conviction of a felony or other crime of moral turpitude.

Members of the Board shall receive compensation for their services and (d)reimbursement for expenses incurred in the performance of duties required by this Chapter, at the rates prescribed in G.S. 93B-5. (e) The Board may employ, subject to the provisions of Chapter 126 of the General Statutes, the necessary personnel for the performance of its functions, and fix their compensation within the limits of funds available to the Board. "§ 90B-6. Functions and duties of the Certification Board. (a) The Board shall administer and enforce the provisions of this Chapter. The Board shall elect from its membership, a chairperson, a vice-chairperson, (b)and secretary-treasurer, and adopt rules to govern its proceedings. A majority of the membership shall constitute a quorum for all Board meetings. (c)The Board shall examine and pass on the qualifications of all applicants for certificates and licenses under this Chapter, and shall issue a certificate or license to each successful applicant therefor. The Board may adopt a seal which may be affixed to all certificates and (d) licenses issued by the Board. The Board may authorize expenditures deemed necessary to carry out the (e) provisions of this Chapter from the fees which it collects, but in no event shall expenditures exceed the revenues of the Board during any fiscal year. No State appropriations shall be subject to the administration of the Board. The Board shall establish and receive fees not to exceed fifty dollars (\$50.00) (f)for initial or renewal application. Fees for the national written examination shall be the cost of the examination to the Board plus an additional fee not to exceed fifty dollars (\$50,00). The fee for late renewal shall not exceed fifteen dollars (\$15.00). The Board shall maintain accounts of all receipts and make expenditures from Board receipts for any purpose which is reasonable and necessary for the proper performance of its duties under this Chapter. (g) The Board shall have the power to establish or approve study or training courses and to establish reasonable standards for certification and certificate renewal, certification, licensure, and renewal of certification and licensure, including but not limited to the power to adopt or use examination materials and accreditation standards of the Council on Social Work Education or other recognized accrediting agency and the power to establish reasonable standards for continuing social work education; provided that for certificate and license renewal no examination shall be required; provided further, that the Board shall not have the power to withhold approval of study or training courses offered by a college or university having a social work program approved by the Council on Social Work Education. Subject to the provisions of Chapter 150B of the General Statutes, the Board (h)shall have the power to adopt, amend, or rescind rules and regulations to carry out the purposes of this Chapter, including but not limited to the power to adopt ethical and disciplinary standards.

30	services, materials, and returned bank items. All fees derived from services provided by

27	of experience in an administrative setting with appropriate supervision

31 32	(f) The Board may issue a provisional <u>certificate license</u> in clinical social work to a person who has a <u>master's masters</u> or <u>doctor's doctoral</u> degree in a social work program

33 34	Social Work Education and desires to be certified-licensed as a clinical social worker.
35	The provisional certificate license may not be issued for a period exceeding two years and
36	the person issued the provisional certificate -license must practice under the supervision of
37	a <u>certified licensed</u> clinical social worker or a Board-approved alternate.
38	"§ 90B-8. Persons from other jurisdictions.
39	(a) The Board may grant a certificate without examination or by special
40	examination to any person who, at the time of application, is certified, registered or
41	licensed as a social worker by a similar board of another country, state, or territory whose
42	certification, registration or licensing standards are substantially equivalent to those

42 certification, registration of neelising standards are substantiany equivalent to those
43 required by this Chapter. <u>The applicant shall have passed an examination in the country</u>,

state, or territory in which he or she is certified, registered, or licensed that is equivalent
to the examination required for the level of certification or licensure sought in this State.

3 The Board may issue a temporary license to a nonresident clinical social (b)4 worker who is either certified, registered, or licensed in another jurisdiction whose 5 standards, in the opinion of the Board, at the time of the person's certification, 6 registration, or licensure were substantially equivalent to or higher than the requirements 7 of this Chapter. Nothing in this Chapter shall be construed as prohibiting a nonresident 8 clinical social worker certified, registered, or licensed in another state from rendering professional clinical social work services in this State for a period of not more than five 9 10 days in any calendar year. All persons granted a temporary clinical social worker license shall comply with the supervision requirements established by the Board. 11

12 "§ 90B-9. Renewal of certificates. certificates and licenses.

(a) All certificates <u>and licenses</u> shall be effective upon date of issuance by the
Board, and shall <u>expire-be renewed</u> on <u>or before</u> the second June 30 thereafter.

15 (b)All certificates and licenses issued hereunder shall be renewed at the times and in the manner provided by this section. At least 45 days prior to expiration of each 16 17 certificate, certificate or license, the Board shall mail a notice and application for certificate 18 renewal to the person certified for the current certification period. certificate holder or licensee. Prior to the expiration date, the applicant must return the notice application shall 19 20 be returned properly completed, together with a renewal fee established by the Board 21 pursuant to G.S. 90B-6.2(a)(5) and evidence of completion of the continuing education requirements established by the Board under-pursuant to G.S. 90B-6(g), upon receipt of 22 23 which the Board shall issue to the person to be certified the renewed certificate for the period 24 stated on the certificate. renew the certificate or license. Any person certified who allows his certificate to lapse for failure to apply for 27 (c)renewal within 45 days after notice shall have his or her certificate automatically 28 29 suspended, and be subject to a late renewal fee as established pursuant to G.S. 90B-6(f), and if he or she fails to apply for renewal of a certificate within one year after date of 30 such suspension, the certificate shall lapse and may be reissued only upon application as 31 32 for an original certificate. A certificate or license issued under this Chapter shall be 33 automatically suspended for failure to renew for a period of more than 60 days after the renewal date. The Board may reinstate a certificate or license suspended under this 34 35 subsection upon payment of a reinstatement fee as provided in G.S. 90B-6.2(a)(7), and may require that the applicant file a new application, furnish new supervisory reports or 36 references or otherwise update his or her credentials, or submit to examination for 37 38 reinstatement. The Board shall have exclusive jurisdiction to investigate alleged violations of this Chapter by any person whose certificate or license has been suspended 39 40 under this subsection and, upon proof of any violation of this Chapter, the Board may take disciplinary action as provided in G.S. 90B-11. 41

such notice, his or her name shall be placed upon the nonpracticing list and he or she 1 2 shall not be subject to payment or of renewal fees. fees while temporarily retired. In order 3 to renew certification, application for renewal shall be made in ordinary course with a renewal 4 fee for the current period. reinstate certification or licensure, the person shall apply to the 5 Board by making a request for reinstatement and paying the appropriate fee as provided 6 in G.S. 90B-6.2. 7 "§ 90B-10. 38	by a licensed	clinical social worker or other licensed mental health professional
39	designated by t	he Board and to a physical examination by a physician or other licensed
40	health profession	onal designated by the Board. The examination may be ordered by the
41	Board before o	r after charges are presented against the applicant, certificate holder, or
42	licensee and th	e results of the examination shall be reported directly to the Board and
43	shall be admissi	ible in evidence in a hearing before the Board.

1	(e) The Board shall provide the opportunity for a hearing under Article 3A of
2	Chapter 150B of the General Statutes to: (i) any person whose certification or licensure
3	was denied or granted subject to restrictions, probation, disciplinary action, remediation,
4	or other conditions or limitations; and (ii) any certificate holder or licensee before
5	revoking or suspending his or her certificate or license or restricting his or her practice or
6	imposing any other disciplinary action or remediation. If the applicant, certificate holder,
7	or licensee waives the opportunity for a hearing, the Board's denial, revocation,
8	suspension, or other action shall be final. No applicant, certificate holder, or licensee
9	shall be entitled to a hearing for failure to pass a qualifying examination.
10	(f) In any proceeding before the Board, complaint or notice of charges against any
11	applicant, certificate holder, or licensee, and any decision rendered by the Board, the
12	Board may withhold from public disclosure the identity of any client who has not
13	consented to the public disclosure of social work services provided to him or her by the
14	applicant, certificate holder, or licensee. If necessary for the protection and rights of a
15	client and the full presentation of relevant evidence, the Board may close a hearing to the
16	public and receive evidence involving or concerning the delivery of social work services.
17	(g) <u>Records</u> , papers, and other documents containing information collected and
18	compiled by or on behalf of the Board as a result of an investigation, inquiry, or interview
19	conducted in connection with certification, licensure, or a disciplinary matter shall not be
20	considered public records within the meaning of Chapter 132 of the General Statutes.
21	Any notice or statement of charges, notice of hearing, or decision rendered in connection
22	with a hearing, shall be a public record. Information that identifies a client who has not
23	consented to the public disclosure of services rendered to him or her by a person certified
24	or licensed under this Chapter shall be deleted from the public record. All other records,
25	papers, and documents containing information collected and compiled by or on behalf of
26	the Board shall be public records, but any information that identifies a client who has not
27	consented to the public disclosure of services rendered to him or her shall be deleted.
28	(h) The Board may assess the costs of disciplinary action against an applicant,
29	certificate holder, or licensee found to be in violation of this Chapter.
30	"§ 90B-12. Violation a misdemeanor.
31	Any person violating any provision of this Chapter is guilty of a Class 2
32	misdemeanor.
33	"§ 90B-13. Injunction.
34	As an additional remedy, the Board may proceed in a superior court to enjoin and
35	restrain any person from violating the prohibitions of this Chapter. The Board shall not be

restrain any person from violating the prohibitions of this Chapter. The Board shall not berequired to post bond in connection with such proceeding.
