1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE DIVISION OF MOTOR VEHICLES TO ISSUE
3	UNIVERSITY HEALTH SYSTEMS OF EASTERN CAROLINA SPECIAL
4	REGISTRATION PLATES AND TO MODIFY THE SPECIAL REGISTRATION
5	PLATES ISSUED TO MEMBERS OF THE JUDICIARY.
6	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
7	Section 1. G.S. 20-79.4(b) reads as rewritten:
8	"(b) Types The Division shall issue the following types of special registration
9	plates:
10	
11	(48a) University Health Systems of Eastern Carolina. – Issuable to the
12	registered owner of a motor vehicle in accordance with G.S. 20-
13	81.12. The plate may bear a phrase or insignia representing the
14	University Health Systems of Eastern Carolina.
15	
16	Section 2. G.S. 20-79.7(a) reads as rewritten:
17	"(a) Fees. – Upon request, the Division shall provide and issue free of charge one
18	registration plate to a recipient of the Congressional Medal of Honor, a 100% disabled
19	veteran, and an ex-prisoner of war. All other special registration plates are subject to the

regular motor vehicle registration fee in G.S. 20-87 or G.S. 20-88 plus an additional fee 1 41.

20	Section 3. G.S. 20-79.7(b) reads as	rewritten:

21 "(b) Distribution of Fees. - The Special Registration Plate Account and the Collegiate and Cultural Attraction Plate Account are established within the Highway 22 23 Fund. The Division must credit the additional fee imposed for the special registration plates listed in subsection (a) among the Special Registration Plate Account (SRPA), the 24 Collegiate and Cultural Attraction Plate Account (CCAPA), and the Natural Heritage 25 Trust Fund (NHTF), which is established under G.S. 113-77.7, as follows: 26

43	Section 4. G.S. 20-81.12 is ame	nded by adding	a new subsecti	on to read:

1	"(b9) University Health Systems of Eastern Carolina The Division must receive
2	300 or more applications for a University Health Systems of Eastern Carolina plate
3	before the plate may be developed. The Division shall transfer quarterly the money in the
4	Collegiate and Cultural Attraction Plate Account derived from the sale of University
5	Health Systems of Eastern Carolina plates to the Pitt Memorial Hospital Foundation, Inc.,
6	for use in the Children's Hospital of Eastern North Carolina."
7	Section 5. G.S. 20-79.6 reads as rewritten:
8	"§ 20-79.6. Special registration plates for members of the judiciary.
9	(a) Appellate Division.Supreme Court. – A special plate issued to a Justice or
10	Judge of the North Carolina Appellate Courts shall bear the letter "J"followed by a
11	number from 1 through 19. of the North Carolina Supreme Court shall bear the words
12	'Supreme Court' and the Great Seal of North Carolina and a number from 1 through 7.
13	The Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of North Carolina shall be issued the plate
14	bearing the number 1 and the remaining plates shall be issued to the Associate Justices on
15	the basis of seniority.
16	Special plates issued to retired members of the Supreme Court shall bear a number
17	indicating the member's position of seniority at the time of retirement followed by the
18	letter 'X' to indicate the member's retired status.
19	(a1) Court of Appeals. – A special plate issued to a Judge of the North Carolina
20	Court of Appeals shall bear the words 'Court of Appeals' and the Great Seal of North
21	Carolina and a number beginning with the number 1. The Chief Judge of the North
22	Carolina Court of Appeals shall be issued the next judicial plate a plate with the number 1
23	and the remaining plates shall be issued to the Associate Judges with the numbers
24	<u>assigned</u> on the basis of seniority.
25 26	Special plates issued to retired members of the Supreme Court and the Court of Appeals
26 27	shall bear a number indicating the member's position of seniority at the time of retirement
27	followed by the letter 'X' to indicate the member's retired status.
28 29	(b) Superior Court. – A special plate issued to a resident superior court judge shall bear the letter 'J' followed by a number indicative of the judicial district the judge serves.
29 30	The number issued to the senior resident superior court judge shall be equal to the sum of
30 31	the numerical designation of the judge's judicial district, as defined in $G.S. 7A-41.1(a)(1)$ ,
32	<u>plus 20. G.S. 7A-41.1(a)(1).</u> If a district has more than one regular resident superior
33	court judge, a special plate for a resident superior court judge of that district shall bear the
34	number issued to the senior resident superior court judge followed by a hyphen and a
35	letter of the alphabet beginning with the letter 'A' to indicate the judge's seniority.
36	For a set of districts as defined in G.S. $7A-41.1(a)(2)$ , other than $\frac{7A \text{ and } 7C}{\text{districts}}$
37	where there are two or more resident superior court judges, the number issued to the
38	senior resident superior court judge shall be equal to the sum of 20 plus the number the
39	districts in the set have in common. A special plate issued to the other regular resident
40	superior court judges of the set of districts shall bear the number issued to the senior
41	resident superior court judge followed by a hyphen and a letter of the alphabet beginning
42	with the letter 'A' to indicate the judge's seniority among all of the regular resident
43	superior court judges of the set of districts. The letter assigned to a resident superior

court judge will not necessarily correspond with the letter designation of the district the 1 2 judge serves. For the set of districts 7B and 7C, the senior resident superior court judge for that 3 set shall be issued a special plate bearing the designation 27C following the letter "J", and all 4 other resident superior court judges of the set shall be issued a special plate bearing that 5 designation followed by the letter "B". Where there are two or more regular resident superior court judges for the district or 6 7 set of districts, the registration plate with the letter 'A' shall be issued to the judge who, 8 from among all the regular resident superior court judges of the district or set of districts, 9 has the most continuous service as a regular resident superior court judge; provided if two 10 or more judges are of equal service, the oldest of those judges shall receive the next letter 11 registration plate. Thereafter, registration plates shall be issued based on seniority within the district or set of districts. 12 A special judge, emergency judge, or retired judge of the superior court shall be 13 14 issued a special plate bearing the letter 'J' followed by a number designated by the 15 Administrative Office of the Courts with the approval of the Chief Justice of the Supreme 16 Court of North Carolina. The plate for a retired judge shall have the letter 'X' after the 17 designated number to indicate the judge's retired status.

District Court. – A special plate issued to a North Carolina district court judge 18 19 shall bear the letter 'J' followed by a number. For the chief judge of the district court 20 district, the number shall be equal to the sum of the numerical designation of the district 21 court district the chief judge serves, plus 100. The number for all other judges of the 22 district courts serving within the same district court district shall be the same number as 23 appears on the special plate issued to the chief district judge followed by a letter of the 24 alphabet beginning with the letter 'A' to indicate the judge's seniority. A retired district court judge shall be issued a similar plate except that the numerical designation shall be 25 26 followed by the letter 'X' to indicate the judge's retired status.

27 United States. - A special plate issued to a Justice of the United States (d)28 Supreme Court, a Judge of the United States Circuit Court of Appeals, or a District Judge 29 of the United States District Court residing in North Carolina shall bear the words 'U.S. J' followed by a number beginning with '1'. The number shall reflect the judge's seniority 30 based on continuous service as a United States Judge as designated by the Secretary of 31 32 State. A judge who has retired or taken senior status shall be issued a similar plate except that the number shall be based on the date of the judge's retirement or assumption of 33 34 senior status and shall follow the numerical designation of active justices and judges." 35 Section 6. This act is effective when it becomes law.
