Referred to: Rules and Operations of the Senate. March 22, 1999 A JOINT RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE LEGISLATIVE RESEARCH COMMISSION TO STUDY SUBSTANCE ABUSE AFTERCARE AND SCIENCE-BASED PREVENTION. Be it resolved by the Senate, the House of Representatives concurring: Section 1. The Legislative Research Commission may study substance abuse aftercare and science-based prevention. The study may include, but is not limited to, the following: The underlying issues relative to substance abuse, such as the economic, (1) social, psychological, and cultural reasons for obstacles to success in remaining drug free; Approaches to overcoming those obstacles to success; (2) Better processes and methods for aftercare, rehabilitation, and (3) readjustment to societal norms and expectations; Review of programs that have proven to be successful over the long (4) term in working with recovering addicts in nonclinical settings; and Review of the development and implementation of science-based (5) prevention programs and policies. Section 2. The Legislative Research Commission may make an interim report

to the 1999 General Assembly, 2000 Regular Session, and shall make a final report to the
