April 10, 2001 1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 2 AN ACT TO ALLOW HOLDERS OF AGE 70 LIFETIME SPORTSMAN LICENSES 3 TO USE CROSSBOWS DURING ANY HUNTING SEASON. 4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 5 **SECTION 1.** G.S. 113-270.1D(b) reads as rewritten: Lifetime Sportsman Licenses. Lifetime sportsman licenses are valid for the 6 "(b) 7 lifetime of the holders and entitle the holders to take all wild animals and wild birds by 8 all lawful methods in all open seasons, including the use of game lands, and to fish with 9 hook and line for all fish in all inland and joint fishing waters, including public mountain trout waters. Lifetime sportsman licenses issued by the Wildlife Resources 10 11 Commission are: 12 Infant Lifetime Sportsman License – \$200.00. This license shall be (1) 13 issued only to an individual under one year of age. 14 Youth Lifetime Sportsman License – \$350.00. This license shall be (2) 15 issued only to an individual under 12 years of age. Adult Resident Lifetime Sportsman License – \$500.00. This license 16 (3) 17 shall be issued only to an individual resident of the State. Nonresident Lifetime Sportsman License – \$1,000. This license shall 18 (4) be issued only to an individual nonresident of the State. 19 20 Age 70 Resident Lifetime Sportsman License – \$10.00. This license (5) 21 shall be issued only to an individual resident of the State who is at 22 least 70 years of age. In addition to the other entitlements of holders of 23 lifetime sportsman licenses, the holder of this license may use a 24 crossbow during any hunting season established by the Wildlife 25 Resources Commission. Disabled Resident Sportsman License – \$100.00. This license shall be 26 (6)

issued only to (i) an individual resident of the State who is a fifty

1	percent (50%) or more disabled veteran as determined by the United
2	States Department of Veterans Affairs, remaining valid for the lifetime
3	of the individual so long as the individual remains fifty percent (50%)
4	or more disabled; or (ii) an individual resident of the State who is
5	totally disabled, remaining valid for the lifetime of the individual so
6	long as the individual remains totally disabled. For purposes of this
7	section, 'totally disabled' means physically incapable of being gainfully
8	employed."
