A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT TO REVISE AND CONSOLIDATE THE CHARTER OF THE TOWN OF
LITTLETON.
The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
SECTION 1. The Charter of the Town of Littleton is revised and
consolidated to read as follows:
"THE CHARTER OF THE TOWN OF LITTLETON.
"ARTICLE I. INCORPORATION, CORPORATE POWERS AND
BOUNDARIES.
"Section 1.1. Incorporation. The Town of Littleton, North Carolina in Halifax
County and the inhabitants thereof shall continue to be a municipal body politic and
corporate, under the name of the 'Town of Littleton,' hereinafter at times referred to as
the 'Town.'
"Section 1.2. Powers. The Town shall have and may exercise all of the powers,
duties, rights, privileges and immunities conferred upon the Town of Littleton
specifically by this Charter or upon municipal corporations by general law. The term
'general law' is employed herein as defined in G.S. 160A-1.
"Section 1.3. Corporate Limits. The corporate limits shall be those existing at the
time of ratification of this Charter, as set forth on the official map of the Town, and as
they may be altered from time to time in accordance with law. An official map of the
Town, showing the current municipal boundaries, shall be maintained permanently in
the office of the Town Clerk and shall be available for public inspection. Upon
alteration of the corporate limits pursuant to law, the appropriate changes to the official
map shall be made and copies shall be filed in the office of the Secretary of State, the
Halifax County Register of Deeds, and the appropriate board of elections.

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2	"ARTICLE II. GOVERNING BODY.
2	"Section 2.1. Town Governing Body. The Board of Commissioners, hereinafter
4	referred to as the 'Board,' and the Mayor shall be the governing body of the Town.
5	"Section 2.2. Board of Commissioners; Composition; Terms of Office. The Board
6	shall be composed of five members, to be elected by all the qualified voters of the
7	Town, for staggered terms of four years or until their successors are elected and
8	qualified.
9	"Section 2.3. Mayor; Term of Office; Duties. The Mayor shall be elected by all the
10	qualified voters of the Town for a term of four years or until his or her successor is
11	elected and qualified. The Mayor shall be the official head of the Town government and
12	shall preside at meetings of the Board. He shall have the right to vote only when there is
13	an equal division on any question or matter before the Board, and shall exercise the
14	powers and duties conferred by law or as directed by the Board.
15	"Section 2.4. Mayor Pro Tempore. In accordance with general law, the Board shall
16	elect one of its members to act as Mayor Pro Tempore to perform the duties of the
17	Mayor during his or her absence or disability.
18	"Section 2.5. Meetings. In accordance with general law, the Board shall establish a
19	suitable time and place for its regular meetings. Special and emergency meetings may
20	be held as provided by general law.
21	"Section 2.6. Quorum; Voting. Official actions of the Board and all votes shall be
22	taken in accordance with the applicable provisions of general law, particularly G.S.
23	160A-75. The quorum provisions of G.S. 160A-74 shall apply.
24	"Section 2.7. Compensation; Qualifications for Office; Vacancies. The
25	compensation and qualifications of the Mayor and Commissioners shall be in
26	accordance with general law. Vacancies that occur in any elective office of the Town
27	shall be filled by majority vote of the remaining members of the Board and shall be
28	filled for the remainder of the unexpired term, notwithstanding the contrary provisions
29	of G.S. 160A-63.
30	"ARTICLE III. ELECTIONS.
31	"Section 3.1. Regular Municipal Elections. Regular municipal elections shall be
32	held in each odd-numbered year in accordance with the uniform municipal election laws
33	of North Carolina. Elections shall be conducted on a nonpartisan basis and the results
34	determined by a plurality as provided in G.S. 163-292.
35	"Section 3.2. Election of Mayor. At the regular municipal election in 2001, and
36	quadrennially thereafter, a Mayor shall be elected to serve a term of four years.
37	"Section 3.3. Election of Commissioners. At the municipal election to be held in
38	1999, the three candidates for Commissioner who receive the highest number of votes
39	shall be elected for four-year terms and the two candidates who receive the next highest
40	number of votes shall be elected for two-year terms. At the regular municipal election in
41	2001, and quadrennially thereafter, two Commissioners shall be elected to four-year
42	terms. At the regular municipal election in 2003, and quadrennially thereafter, three
43	Commissioners shall be elected to four-year terms.

"Section 3.4. Special Elections and Referenda. Special elections and referenda 1 2 may be held only as provided by general law or applicable local acts of the General 3 Assembly. "ARTICLE IV. ORGANIZATION AND ADMINISTRATION. 4 5 "Section 4.1. Form of Government. The Town shall operate under the 6 mayor-council form of government as provided in Part 3 of Article 7 of Chapter 160A 7 of the General Statutes. 8 "Section 4.2. Town Attorney. The Board shall appoint a Town Attorney licensed to 9 practice law in North Carolina. It shall be the duty of the Town Attorney to represent 10 the Town, advise Town officials, and perform other duties required by law or as the Board may direct. 11 12 "Section 4.3. Town Clerk. The Board shall appoint a Town Clerk to keep a journal 13 of the proceedings of the Board, to maintain official records and documents, to give 14 notice of meetings, and to perform such other duties required by law or as the Board 15 may direct. "Section 4.4. Tax Collector. The Town shall appoint a Tax Collector to collect all 16 17 taxes owed to the Town and perform those duties specified in G.S. 105-350 and such 18 other duties as prescribed by law or assigned by the Board. 19 "Section 4.5. Other Administrative Officers and Employees. The Board may 20 authorize other positions to be filled by appointment and may organize the Town 21 government as deemed appropriate, subject to the requirements of general law." 22 **SECTION 2.** The purpose of this act is to revise the Charter of the Town of 23 Littleton and to consolidate certain acts concerning the property, affairs, and 24 government of the Town. It is intended to continue without interruption those 25 provisions of prior acts that are expressly consolidated into this act so that all rights and liabilities that have accrued are preserved and may be enforced. 26 27 **SECTION 3.** This act does not repeal or affect any acts concerning the 28 property, affairs, or government of public schools in the Town, or any acts validating, 29 confirming, approving, or legalizing official actions, proceedings, contracts, or 30 obligations of any kind. 31 **SECTION 4.** The following acts, having served the purposes for which they 32 were enacted or having been consolidated into this act, are expressly repealed: 33 Chapter 175 of the Public Laws of 1876-77. 34 Chapter 126 of the Private Laws of 1883. 35 Chapter 171 of the Private Laws of 1893. 5 **SECTION 5.** The Mayor and Commissioners serving on the date of 6 ratification of this act shall serve until the expiration of their terms or until their 7 successors are elected and qualified. Thereafter those offices shall be filled as provided 8 in Articles II and III of the Charter contained in Section 1 of this act.

9 **SECTION 6.** This act does not affect any rights or interests that arose under 10 any provisions repealed by this act.

11 **SECTION 7.** All existing ordinances, resolutions, and other provisions of 12 the Town of Littleton not inconsistent with the provisions of this act shall continue in 13 effect until repealed or amended.

14 **SECTION 8.** No action or proceeding pending on the effective date of this 15 act by or against the Town or any of its departments or agencies shall be abated or 16 otherwise affected by this act.

17 **SECTION 9.** If any provision of this act or application thereof is held 18 invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this act that 19 can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the 20 provisions of this act are declared to be severable.

SECTION 10. Whenever a reference is made in this act to a particular provision of the General Statutes, and that provision is later amended, superseded, or recodified, the reference shall be deemed amended to refer to the amended General Statute, or to the General Statute that most clearly corresponds to the statutory provision that is superseded or recodified.

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SECTION 11. This act is effective when it becomes law.
