15	The Division shall refuse registration or issuance of a certificate of title or any
16	transfer of registration upon any of the following grounds:

18	(9) The applicant motor carrier is subject to an order issued by the Federal
19	Motor Carrier Safety Administration or the Division to cease all
20	operations based on a finding that the continued operations of the
21	motor carrier pose an 'imminent hazard' as defined in 49 C.F.R.
22	<u>§ 386.72(b)(1).</u> "
23	SECTION 2. G.S. 20-110 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:
24	"(m) The Division shall rescind and cancel the registration of vehicles of a motor
25	carrier that is subject to an order issued by the Federal Motor Carrier Safety
26	Administration or the Division to cease all operations based on a finding that the
27	continued operations of the motor carrier pose an 'imminent hazard' as defined in 49
28	<u>C.F.R. § 386.72(b)(1).</u> "
