5	"(a)		lopment Zone Defined A development zone is an area comprised of		
6	one or more contiguous census tracts, census block groups, or both in the most recent				
7 federal decennial census that meets all of the following conditions:					
8		(1)	Every census tract and census block group in the zone is located in		
9			whole or in part within the primary corporate limits of a city with a		
10			population of more than 5,000-2,500 according to the most recent		
11			annual population estimates certified by the State Planning Officer.		
12		(2)	It has a population of 1,000 or more according to the most recent		
13			annual population estimates certified by the State Planning Officer.		
14		(3)	More than twenty percent (20%) of its population is below the poverty		
15			level according to the most recent federal decennial census.		
16		(4)	Every census tract and census block group in the zone meets at least		
17			one of the following conditions:		
18			a. More than ten percent (10%) of its population is below the		
19			poverty level according to the most recent federal decennial		
20			census.		
21			b. It is immediately adjacent to another census tract or census		
22			block group that is in the same zone and has more than twenty		
23			percent (20%) of its population below the poverty level		
24			according to the most recent federal decennial census.		
25		(5)	None of the census tracts or census block groups in the zone is located		
26			in another development zone designated by the Secretary of		

SECTION 2. This act is effective for taxable years beginning on or after 2 January 1, 2002.
