1	(a) Any j	person who desires to be licensed as an "electrologist" pursuant to this	
2	Chapter shall:		
3	(1)	Submit an application on a form approved by the Board;Board.	
4	(2)	Be a resident of North Carolina;Carolina.	
5	(3)	Be 18 years of age or older; older.	
6	(4)	Meet the requirements of subsection (a1) of this section; and section.	
7	(5)	Pass an examination given by the Board.	
8 9	<u>(6)</u>	Submit the application and examination fees required in G.S. 88A-9(b).	
10	(a1) An ap	pplicant for licensure under this section shall provide:	
11	(1) (1)	Proof of graduation from a school certified by the Board pursuant to	
12	(1)	G.S. 88A-19; or	
12	(2)	Proof satisfactory to the Board that, for at least one year prior to the	
13	(2)	date of application or the date of initial residence in this State,

10	Subdivision (2) of this subsection applies only to applicants whose residence in this		
18	State began on or after January 31, 1994, who do not meet the qualifications of		
19	subdivision (1) of this subsection or G.S. 88A-12.		
20	(b) At least twice each year, the Board shall give an examination to applicants for		
21	licensure to determine the applicants' knowledge of the basic and clinical sciences		
22	relating to the theory and practice of electrology. The Board shall give applicants notice		
23	of the date, time, and place of the examination at least 60 days in advance.		
24	(c) When the Board determines that an applicant has met all the		
25	qualificationsrequirements for licensure, and has submitted the required fee, initial		
26	license fee required in G.S. 88A-9(b), the Board shall issue a license to the applicant.		
27	(d) An applicant otherwise qualified for licensure who is not a resident of this		
28	State may nevertheless submit a statement of intent to begin practicing electrology in		
29	this State and receive a license. The applicant must provide to the Board within six		
30	months of receiving a license evidence satisfactory to the Board that the applicant has		
31	actually begun to practice electrology in this State. The Board may revoke the license of		
32	an applicant who fails to submit this proof or whose proof fails to satisfy the Board."		
33	SECTION 3. G.S. 88A-14 reads as rewritten:		
34	"§ 88A-14. Inactive list.		
35	Upon reques	st by a licensee for inactive status, the Board shall place the licensee's	
36	name on the inactive list. While on the inactive list, the person shall not be subjected to		
37	renewal requirements and shall not practice electrology in North Carolina. When that		
38	person desires to be removed from the inactive list and returned to an active list, an <u>a</u>		
39	reactivation application shall be submitted to the Board on a form furnished by the		
40	Board and the fee shall be paid for license renewal.reactivation. The Board may require		
41	evidence of competency to resume practice before returning the applicant to the active		
42	status. Any person whose license has lapsed or expired for a period of five years or		
43	more shall be required to take and pass the examination for licensure before the license		
44	can be renewed.<u>reactivated.</u>"
