2	AN ACT TO INCORPORATE THE TOWN OF DUCK.		
3	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:		
4	SECTION 1. A Charter for the Town of Duck is enacted to read:		
5	"CHARTER OF THE TOWN OF DUCK.		
6	"ARTICLE I. INCORPORATION AND CORPORATE POWERS.		
7	"Section 1.1. Incorporation and Corporate Powers. The inhabitants of the Town		
8	are a body corporate and politic under the name 'Town of Duck'. The Town of Duck has		
9	all the powers, duties, rights, privileges, and immunities conferred and imposed on cities		
10	by the general law of North Carolina.		
11	"ARTICLE II. CORPORATE BOUNDARIES.		
12	"Section 2.1. Town Boundaries. Until modified in accordance with law, the		
13	boundaries of the Town of Duck are as follows:		
14	BEGINNING at the point of intersection of the northeast corner of the corporate		
15	limits of the Town of Southern Shores in Dare County, North Carolina, with the mean		
16	high watermark of the Atlantic Ocean; thence along a line in a general easterly direction		
17	for a distance of 1,000 feet to a point along an eastern projection of the northern Town		
18	of Southern Shores limit line to a point in the Atlantic Ocean; thence, in a northwesterly		
19	direction along a line 1,000 feet parallel to the mean high watermark of the Atlantic		
20	Ocean until such line forms a point of intersection with another line, such line being the		
21	projection of the Dare County boundary line 1,000 feet easterly from the mean high		
22	watermark of the Atlantic Ocean; thence, in a westerly direction along the projected line		
23	to the intersection of Dare County boundary line with the mean high watermark of the		
24	Atlantic Ocean; thence, in a westerly direction along the Dare County boundary line to a		
25	point of intersection of the Dare County boundary line with the mean high watermark of		
26	the Currituck Sound; thence, along a line in a general westerly direction for a distance		
27	of 1,000 feet to a point along a western projection of the Dare County boundary line to a		
28	point in the Currituck Sound; thence, in a southeasterly direction along a line 1,000 feet		
29	parallel to the mean high watermark of the Currituck Sound until such line forms a point		

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1 of intersection with another line, such line being the projection of the northern line of 2 the Town of Southern Shores corporate limits 1,000 feet westerly from the mean high 3 watermark of the Currituck Sound; thence, in an easterly direction along the projected 4 line to the intersection of the northwest corner of the Town of Southern Shores 5 corporate limits with the mean high watermark of the Currituck Sound; thence, in an 6 easterly direction along the northern line of the Town of Southern Shores corporate 7 limits to the place of beginning.

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"ARTICLE III. GOVERNING BODY.

9 "Section 3.1. Structure of Governing Body; Number of Members. The governing
10 body of the Town of Duck shall be the Town Council, which shall have five members.

"Section 3.2. Temporary Officers. Until the organizational meeting after the initial election of 2002 provided for by Article IV of this Charter, Allan W. Beres, Nancy R. Caviness, Paul F. Keller, Manfred E. Schwarz, and Judith L. Wessel are appointed to the Town Council of the Town of Duck. The temporary officers shall elect persons to serve as Interim Mayor and Interim Mayor Pro Tempore. If any person named in this section is unable to serve, the remaining temporary officers shall, by majority vote, appoint a person to serve until the initial election is held.

18 "Section 3.3. Manner of Electing Council; Term of Office. The qualified voters of 19 the entire Town shall elect members of the Town Council from the Town at large, and 20 the members shall each serve a term of two years, except that the members elected in 2002 shall serve until the organizational meeting after the 2003 municipal election. To 22 be eligible for election to the Town Council an individual must reside in the Town of 23 Duck. Vacancies on the Town Council shall be filled in accordance with G.S. 160A-63.

24 "Section 3.4. Manner of Electing Mayor; Term of Office; Duties. The Mayor 25 shall be elected from among the members of the Town Council at the organizational meeting after the initial election in November 2002, and shall serve for a term of one 26 27 year. In 2003 and biennially thereafter a Mayor shall be chosen by the same process for 28 a term of two years. The Mayor shall attend and preside over meetings of the Town 29 Council, shall advise the Town Council from time to time as to matters involving the 30 Town of Duck, and shall have the right to vote as a member of the Town Council on all matters before the Council, but shall have no right to break a tie vote in which the 31 32 Mayor has participated.

"Section 3.5. Manner of Electing Mayor Pro Tempore; Term of Office; Duties. 33 34 The Mayor Pro Tempore shall be elected from among the members of the Town 35 Council at the organizational meeting after the initial election in November 2002, and 36 shall serve for a term of one year. In 2003 and biennially thereafter a Mayor Pro Tempore shall be chosen by the same process for a term of two years. The Mayor Pro 37 38 Tempore shall act in the absence or disability of the Mayor. If the Mayor and Mayor Pro Tempore are both absent from a meeting of the Town Council, the members of the 39 Town Council present may elect a temporary chairman to preside in the absence. The 40 41 Mayor Pro Tempore shall have the right to vote on all matters before the Town Council and shall be considered a member of the Town Council for all purposes. 42

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"Section 3.6. Compensation of Mayor and Town Council. The Mayor and 1 2 members of the Town Council shall be reimbursed for ordinary and necessary expenses 3 and may receive salary and honoraria only upon a majority vote of the qualified voters 4 of the Town who vote on the question in a special referendum. 5 "ARTICLE IV. ELECTIONS. 6 "Section 4.1. Conduct of Town Elections. Elections shall be conducted on a 7 nonpartisan basis and results determined by a plurality as provided in G.S. 163-292. 8 "Section 4.2. Date of Election. Elections shall be conducted in accordance with 9 Chapter 163 of the General Statutes, except that the first election shall be held on 10 November 5, 2002. 11 "Section 4.3. Special Elections and Referenda. Special elections and referenda 12 may be held only as provided by general law or applicable local acts of the General 13 Assembly. 14 "ARTICLE V. ORGANIZATION AND ADMINISTRATION. 15 "Section 5.1. Form of Government. The Town shall operate under the 16 Council-Manager plan as provided in Part 2 of Article 7 of Chapter 160A of the General 17 Statutes. 18 "Section 5.2. Town Manager; Appointment; Power and Duties. The Town Council shall appoint a Town Manager who shall be responsible for the administration 19 20 of all departments of the Town government, except as otherwise directed by the Town 21 Council. The Town Manager shall have all the powers and duties conferred by general law, except as expressly limited by the provisions of this Charter, and the additional 22 23 powers and duties conferred by the Town Council, so far as authorized by general law. 24 "Section 5.3. Town Manager's Authority Over Personnel; Role of Elected 25 Officials. As chief administrator of the Town, the Town Manager shall have the power to appoint, suspend, and remove all Town officers, department heads, and employees, 26 27 except the Town Attorney, Town Clerk, and any other official whose appointment or 28 removal is vested in the Town Council by this Charter or by general law. Neither the 29 Town Council nor any of its members shall take part in the appointment or removal of 30 officers or employees in the administrative service of the Town of Duck, except as provided by this Charter. Except for purposes of inquiry, or for consultation with the 31 32 Town Attorney, the Town Council and its members shall deal with Town employees 33 solely through the Town Manager or Acting Town Manager, and neither the Town 34 Council nor any of its members shall give any specific orders to any subordinates of the 35 Town Manager or Acting Town Manager, either publicly or privately. 36 "Section 5.4. Town Attorney. The Town Council shall appoint a Town Attorney licensed to practice law in North Carolina. It shall be the duty of the Town Attorney to 37 38 represent the Town, advise Town officials, and perform other duties required by law or 39 as the Town Council may direct. 40 "Section 5.5. Town Clerk. The Town Council shall appoint a Town Clerk to keep a

1 documents, to give notice of meetings, and to perform such other duties required by law 2 or as the Town Council may direct. 3 "Section 5.6. Other Administrative Officers and Employees. The Town Council 4 may authorize other offices and positions and appoint persons to fill the offices and 5 positions, or the Council may authorize the offices and positions to be filled by 6 appointment by the Town Manager. The Town Council may organize the Town 7 government as deemed appropriate, subject to the requirements of general law. 8 "Section 5.7. Consolidation of Functions. Where positions are not incompatible, 9 the Town Council may combine in one person the powers and duties of two or more 10 officers created or authorized by this Charter. 11 "ARTICLE VI. TAXES AND BUDGET ORDINANCE. 12 "Section 6.1. Powers of the Town Council. The Town Council may levy those 13 taxes and fees authorized by general law. An affirmative vote equal to a majority of all the members of the Town Council shall be required to change the ad valorem tax rate 14 15 from the rate established during the prior fiscal year. 16 "Section 6.2. Budget. From and after July 1, 2002, the citizens and property in the Town of Duck shall be subject to municipal taxes levied for the fiscal year beginning 17 July 1, 2002, and, for that purpose, the Town shall obtain from Dare County a record of 18 19 property in the area herein incorporated that was listed for taxes as of January 1, 2002. 20 The Town may adopt a budget ordinance for fiscal year 2002-2003 without following 21 the timetable in the Local Government Budget and Fiscal Control Act, but shall follow the sequence of actions in the spirit of the Act insofar as is practical. For fiscal year 22 23 2002-2003, ad valorem taxes may be paid at par or face amount within 90 days of 24 adoption of the budget ordinance and thereafter in accordance with the schedule in G.S. 25 105-360 as if the taxes had been due and payable on September 1, 2002. The Town may adopt a budget ordinance for fiscal year 2001-2002 without following the timetable in 26 27 the Local Government Budget and Fiscal Control Act, but shall follow the sequence of actions in the spirit of the Act insofar as is practical, but no ad valorem taxes shall be 28 29 levied for that year. 30 "ARTICLE VII. ORDINANCES. 31 "Section 7.1. Ordinances. Except as otherwise provided in this Charter, the Town of 32 Duck is authorized to adopt such ordinances as the Town Council deems necessary for 33 the governance of the Town. 34 "ARTICLE VIII. MISCELLANEOUS. "Section 8.1. Conflicts of Interest. No person, or a member of the person's

35 "Section 8.1. **Conflicts of Interest.** No person, or a member of the person's 36 immediate family, who is employed by or is an official of the Town of Duck, shall do 37 business with the Town unless such activity is approved by the Town Council. All 38 appointed officials of the Town shall inform the Town Council of any conflicts of 39 interest, and the failure to so inform shall constitute grounds for immediate dismissal for 40 cause. No official of the Town may accept any gratuity from any business, person, or 41 other official if the gratuity is related to his or her official duties.

1 "Section 8.2. Enlargement of Town Council. The qualified voters of the Town of 2 Duck may seek to enlarge the number of members of the Town Council by submitting a 3 petition to that effect signed by twenty percent (20%) of the qualified voters. Upon 4 passage of a resolution as provided in G.S. 160A-102 or upon receipt of a valid petition, 5 the Town Council shall immediately take steps as provided in Part 4 of Article 5 of 6 Chapter 160A of the General Statutes to determine by referendum whether the number 7 of members of the Town Council should be increased. If a majority of the votes cast in 8 the referendum are in the affirmative, a special election shall be held at the earliest 9 possible date to elect the additional members required to enlarge the Town Council to 10 the number set forth in the referendum.

11 "Section 8.3. Amendments to Charter. The Town Council may propose and enact 12 amendments to this Charter in accordance with Part 4 of Article 5 of Chapter 160A of 13 the General Statutes. No amendment to this Charter shall become effective until public 14 notice is given and a public hearing is held to receive comments on the proposed 15 Charter amendment. Notwithstanding G.S. 160A-103, upon receipt of a referendum petition bearing the signatures and residence addresses of twenty percent (20%) of the 16 17 qualified voters of the Town, the Town Council shall submit ordinances adopted under 18 G.S. 160A-102 to a vote of the people.

19 "Section 8.4. Provision of Services and Administration of Functions. The Town 20 Council may enter into agreements with other governmental bodies and private 21 enterprises for the provision of services and the administration of corporate functions in 22 order to provide the services and administer the functions in the most efficient and 23 cost-effective manner.

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"ARTICLE IX. SPECIAL PROVISIONS.

"Section 9.1. Ad Valorem Taxes. The Town Council shall not increase the ad valorem tax rate more than ten cents (10¢) per one hundred dollars (\$100.00) valuation above the ad valorem tax rate initially established after incorporation of the Town of Duck without the vote or consent of a majority of the qualified voters of the Town of Duck. The procedures of G.S. 160A-209 shall be followed for any such election.

"Section 9.2. Fire Protection. The Town of Duck shall contract with the Duck
Volunteer Fire Department, Inc., to provide fire protection for the Town. The contract
terms and amount paid by the Town of Duck to Duck Volunteer Fire Department, Inc.,
shall be mutually agreed upon and annually renewed by the Board of Directors for the
Duck Volunteer Fire Department, Inc., and the Town Council."

35 **SECTION 2.** The Dare County Board of Elections shall conduct an election 36 on November 6, 2001, for the purpose of submission to the qualified voters of the area 37 described in Section 2.1 of the Charter of the Town of Duck the question of whether or 38 not the area shall be incorporated as the Town of Duck. Registration for the election 39 shall be conducted in accordance with G.S. 163-288.2.

40	SECTION 3. In the election	, the question on the ballot shall be:	
41	"[]FOR	[]AGAINST	
42	Incorporation	Incorporation of the Town of Duck."	

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SECTION 4. In the election, if a majority of the votes are cast "For
 Incorporation of the Town of Duck", Section 1 of this act becomes effective May 1,
 2002. Otherwise, that section shall have no force and effect.

4 **SECTION 5.** This act is effective when it becomes law.
