2	AN ACT TO AMEND THE LAW GOVERNING PLANNING BY THE
3	DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION.
4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
5	SECTION 1. G.S. 136-28.6 reads as rewritten:
6	"§ 136-28.6. Private contract participation by the Department of Transportation.
7	(a) The Department of Transportation may participate in private engineering and
8	construction contracts for State highways.
9	(b) In order to qualify for State participation, the project must be:
10	(1) The construction of a street or highway on the Transportation
11	Improvement Plan adopted by the Department of Transportation; or
12	(2) The construction of a street or highway on a mutually adopted
13	thoroughfare plan transportation plan that is designated a Department
14	of Transportation responsibility.
15	(c) Only those projects in which the developer furnishes the right-of-way without
16	cost to the Department of Transportation are eligible.
17	(d) The Department's participation shall be limited to fifty percent (50%) of the
18	amount of any engineering contract and/or any construction contract let by the
19	developer for the project.
20	(e) Participation in the contracts shall be limited to cost associated with normal
21	practices of the Department of Transportation.
22	(f) Plans for the project must meet Department of Transportation standards and
23	shall be approved by the Department of Transportation.
24	(g) Projects shall be constructed in accordance with the plans and specifications
25	approved by the Department of Transportation.
26	(h) The Secretary shall report in writing, on a quarterly basis, to the Joint
27	Legislative Commission on Governmental Operations on all agreements entered into

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between a private developer and the Department of Transportation for participation in 1 2 private engineering and construction contracts under this section. 3 Municipalities may participate financially in private engineering and (i) 4 construction contracts for projects pertaining to streets or highways which are on a 5 mutually adopted thoroughfare plan transportation plan for said municipality." 6 SECTION 2. G.S. 136-203 is repealed. 7 SECTION 3. G.S. 136-211 reads as written: 8 "§ 136-211. Department authorized to establish Rural Transportation Planning 9 **Organizations.** 10 Authorization. – The Department of Transportation is authorized to form (a) 11 Rural Transportation Planning Organizations. Area Represented. - Rural Transportation Planning Organizations shall 12 (b)13 include representatives from contiguous areas in three to fifteen counties, with a total population of the entire area represented of at least 50,000 persons according to the 14 15 latest population estimate of the Office of State Planning. Noncontiguous counties 16 adjacent to the same Metropolitan Planning Organization may form a Rural 17 Transportation Planning Organization. Areas already included in a Metropolitan 18 Planning Organization shall not be included in the area represented by a Rural 19 Transportation Planning Organization. 20 Membership. - The Rural Transportation Planning Organization shall consist (c) 21 of local elected officials or their designees and representatives of local transportation 22 systems in the area as agreed to by all parties in a memorandum of understanding. Formation; Memorandum of Understanding. - The Department shall notify 23 (d) 24 local elected officials and representatives of local transportation systems around the 25 State of the opportunity to form Rural Transportation Planning Organizations. The 26 Department shall work cooperatively with interested local elected officials, their 27 designees, and representatives of local transportation systems to develop a proposed 28 area, membership, functions, and responsibilities of a Rural Transportation Planning 29 Organization. The agreement of all parties shall be included in a memorandum of 30 understanding approved by the membership of a proposed Rural Transportation 31 Planning Organization and the Secretary of the Department of Transportation." 32 SECTION 4. G.S. 136-213 reads as rewritten: "§ 136-213. Administration and staff. 33 34 Administrative Entity. – Each Rural Transportation Planning Organization, (a) working in cooperation with the Department, shall select an appropriate administrative 35 36 entity for the organization. Eligible administrative entities include, but are not limited 37 to, regional economic development agencies, regional councils of government, 38 chambers of commerce, and local governments. 39 Professional Staff. – The Department, each Rural Transportation Planning (b)

Organization, and any adjacent Metropolitan Planning Organization shall cooperatively
determine the appropriate professional planning staff needs of the organization.

42 (c) Funding. – If funds are appropriated for that purpose, the Department may
43 make grants to Rural Transportation Planning Organizations for professional planning

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- 1 staff. to carry out the duties listed in G.S. 136-212. The members of the Rural
- 2 Transportation Planning Organization shall contribute at least twenty percent (20%) of
- 3 the cost of any staff resources employed by the organization. The Department may
- 4 make additional planning grants to economically distressed counties, as designated by
- 5 the North Carolina Department of Commerce."
- 6 **SECTION 5.** This act is effective when it becomes law.
