1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 2 AN ACT CONCERNING PUBLIC-PRIVATE REIMBURSEMENT AGREEMENTS 3 FOR INFRASTRUCTURE DEVELOPMENT BY THE CITY OF CHARLOTTE. 4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 5 **SECTION 1.** A city may enter into reimbursement agreements with private developers and property owners for the design and construction of municipal 6 infrastructure that is included on the city's Capital Improvement Plan and serves the 7 8 developer or property owner. For the purpose of this act, municipal infrastructure 9 includes, without limitation, water mains, sanitary sewer lines, lift stations, stormwater 10 lines, streets, curb and gutter, sidewalks, traffic control devices, and other associated 11 facilities. 12 **SECTION 2.** A city shall enact ordinances setting forth procedures and 13 terms under which such agreements may be approved. 14 **SECTION 3.** A city may provide for such reimbursements to be paid from 15 any lawful source. 16 **SECTION 4.** No reimbursement pursuant to an agreement authorized by this act shall be deemed to be construction subject to Article 8 of Chapter 143 of the General 17 Statutes or to be deemed to be a violation or evasion of any provision of said Article. 18 19 Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this section, a construction contract subject 20 to a reimbursement agreement authorized by this act shall not be awarded by a developer or property owner who is a party to such reimbursement agreement without 21 22 complying with the requirements of G.S. 143-129 and G.S. 143-128(f) relating to public 23 advertising and bid opening requirements which would be applicable if the construction 24 contract had been awarded by the city. 25 **SECTION 5.** This act applies only to the City of Charlotte. **SECTION 6.** This act is effective when it becomes law. 26
