| 7 | SECTION 1. Article 2 of Chapter 143B of the General Statutes is amended |
| 8 | by adding a new section to read: |
| 9 | " <u>§ 143B-53.1. Admission fees.</u> |
| 10 | In addition to powers granted pursuant to Article 1 of Chapter 121 of the General |
| 11 | Statutes or any other general law, the Department of Cultural Resources may charge an |
| 12 | admission fee to any museum, historic property, or other location or event administered |
| 13 | by the Department. Admission fees collected under this section are receipts of the |
| 14 | Department and shall be deposited in a nonreverting account. The Department shall |
| 15 | retain unbudgeted receipts at the end of each fiscal year, beginning June 30, 2001, and |
| 16 | shall deposit these receipts into the account. Funds in the account shall be used for |
| 17 | maintenance, repairs, renovations, and any other purpose deemed necessary by the |
| 18 | Secretary of Cultural Resources. The Secretary may adopt rules necessary to carry out |
| 19 | the provisions of this section. The Department shall provide an annual report on the use |
| 20 | of fees collected pursuant to this section to the Office of State Budget, Planning, and |
| 21 | Management and to the Fiscal Research Division of the Legislative Services Office." |
| 22 | SECTION 2. This act becomes effective June 30, 2001. |
