1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT AFFECTING THE REGULATION OF ABANDONED OR JUNKED
3	MOTOR VEHICLES IN THE CITY OF GREENVILLE AND THE TOWN OF
4	WAYNESVILLE.
5	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
6	SECTION 1. G.S. 160A-303.2(a) reads as rewritten:
7	"(a) A municipality may by ordinance regulate, restrain or prohibit the
8	abandonment of junked motor vehicles on public grounds and on private property
9	within the municipality's ordinance-making jurisdiction upon a finding that such
10	regulation, restraint or prohibition is necessary and desirable to promote or enhance
11	community, neighborhood or area appearance, and may enforce any such ordinance by
12	removing or disposing of junked motor vehicles subject to the ordinance according to
13	the procedures prescribed in this section. The authority granted by this section shall be
14	supplemental to any other authority conferred upon municipalities. Nothing in this
15	section shall be construed to authorize a municipality to require the removal or disposal
16	of a motor vehicle kept or stored at a bona fide "automobile graveyard" or "junkyard" as
17	defined in G.S. 136-143.
18	For purposes of this section, the term "junked motor vehicle" means a vehicle that
19	does not display a current license plate and that:
20	(1) Is partially dismantled or wrecked; or
21	(2) Cannot be self-propelled or moved in the manner in which it originally
22	was intended to move; or
23	(3) Is more than five years old and appears to be worth less than one
24	hundred dollars (\$100.00).five hundred dollars (\$500.00)."
25	SECTION 2. This act applies to the City of Greenville and the Town of

26 Waynesville only.

SECTION 3. This act is effective when it becomes law.
