The request furthers the purposes of State policy under G.S. 11 b. 122C-2 and mental health, developmental disabilities, and 12 13 substance abuse services reform. 14 c. The request improves the delivery of mental health, 15 developmental disabilities, and substance abuse services in the 16 counties affected by the waiver and also protects the health, 17 safety, and welfare of individuals receiving these services. 18 d. The duties and responsibilities performed by the licensed clinical social worker, the masters level psychiatric nurse, or the 19 masters level certified clinical addictions specialist are within 20 21 the individual's scope of practice. The Secretary shall evaluate the effectiveness, quality, and efficiency 22 (3) of mental health, developmental disabilities, and substance abuse 23 services and protection of health, safety, and welfare under the waiver. 24 The Secretary shall send a report on the evaluation to the Joint 25 Legislative Oversight Committee on Mental Health, Developmental 26 27 Disabilities, and Substances Abuse Services on or before July 1, 2006. 28 (4) The waiver granted by the Secretary under this section shall be in effect for a period not to exceed three years, or the period for which 29 the requesting local management entity's business plan is approved, 30 whichever is shorter. 31 32 (5) The Secretary may grant a waiver under this section to up to five local management entities that have been designated as phase-one entities as 33 of July 1, 2003. 34 35 (6) In no event shall the substitution of a licensed clinical social worker, masters level psychiatric nurse, or masters level certified clinical 36 addictions specialist under a waiver granted under this section be 37 construed as authorization to expand the scope of practice of the 38 licensed clinical social worker, the masters level psychiatric nurse, or 39 the masters level certified clinical addictions specialist. 40 The Department shall assure that staff performing the duties are 41 (7) 42 trained and privileged to perform the functions identified in the waiver. The Department shall involve stakeholders including, but not limited 43

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to, the North Carolina Psychiatric Association, The North Carolina
