7	<b>SECTION 1.</b> G.S. 133-1.1(c) reads as rewritten:		
8	"(c)		following shall be excepted from the requirements of subsection (a) of
9	this section:		
10		(1)	Dwellings and outbuildings in connection therewith, such as barns and
11			private garages.
12		(2)	Apartment buildings used exclusively as the residence of not more
13			than two families.
14		(3)	Buildings used for agricultural purposes other than schools or
15			assembly halls which are not within the limits of a city or an
16			incorporated village.
17		(4)	Temporary buildings or sheds used exclusively for construction
18			purposes, not exceeding 20 feet in any direction, and not used for
19			living quarters.
20		<u>(5)</u>	Pre-engineered garages, sheds, and workshops up to 5,000 square feet
21			used exclusively by city, county, public school, or State employees for
22			purposes related to their employment. For pre-engineered garages,
23			sheds, and workshops constructed pursuant to this subdivision, there
24			shall be a minimum separation of these structures from other buildings
25			or property lines of 30 feet."
26	<b>SECTION 2.</b> This act is effective when it becomes law.
