9 ~~and with notice to the opposing party, that the child has not graduated or attained the~~

11 If an arrearage for child support or fees due exists at the time that a child support
12 obligation terminates, payments shall continue in the same total amount that was due
13 under the terms of the previous court order or income withholding in effect at the time
14 of the support obligation. The total amount of these payments is to be applied to the
15 arrearage until all arrearages and fees are satisfied or until further order of the court."

16 **SECTION 2.** This act is effective when it becomes law and applies to
17 actions for child support on or after that date.
